Executive Summary

Good governance is the process of measuring how public institutions conduct public affairs and manage public resources and guarantee the realization of public aspirations in a manner essentially free of abuse and corruption and with due regard for the rule of law. Good governance adds an evaluative attribute to the process of governing and based on different indicators, an index is computed to evaluate the performance and its impact.

One of the notable aspects of the DGGI reports is their emphasis on creating a healthy competition amongst district administrations to generate excellence in administrative affairs through best practices for the welfare of the general public. The success stories pouring in are an ample proof that release of DGGI reports is playing a catalytic role in making the district administrations more responsive and setting new benchmarks for other districts to emulate.

The DGGI has proven to be a valuable tool for promoting good governance, fostering healthy competition and driving innovation in Jammu and Kashmir. By continuously refining and expanding the scope of these reports, the government is demonstrating its commitment to establishing a transparent, accountable, and efficient governance system that caters to the needs of its citizens and drives sustainable development in the region.

The current issue of DGGI Report 5.0 is fifth edition in series based on data collected for the financial year 2024-25. The performance of District administrations of 20 Districts of UT of Jammu & Kashmir have been evaluated based on 10 sectors having significant role in the economy of the UT. Districts have been ranked based on scores achieved on 58 indicators spread across 10 selected sectors. Incremental change (increase/decrease) of the given indicators have been taken into consideration while calculating the scores.

District Jammu is on the top of composite ranking in DGGI 5.0 with an aggregate DGGI score of 7.0552 while as District Kathua is ranked at the bottom with aggregate DGGI score of 5.5826. District Pulwama & Samba ranked 2nd and 3rd with an aggregate DGGI score of 6.7655 & 6.7587 respectively.

District Jammu though slipped down in few sectors slightly but still maintained 1st rank in overall tally of ranks by improving its performance in Human Resource Development, Social Welfare and Citizen Centric.

District Pulwama stood 1st in Agriculture and Allied Sector, 2nd in Citizen Centric Governance besides improving its performance in Public Health, Social Welfare & Development and Legal and Public Safety sectors as compared to DGGI 4.0 thus securing **2nd rank in DGGI 5.0**. Similarly, **District Samba** secured 2nd rank in Public health and Financial Inclusion besides improvement in sectors such as Social Welfare & Development and Legal and Public Safety in comparison to its performance in DGGI 4.0. The district also maintained rank **3rd in DGGI 5.0**.

So far as overall ranking is concerned, District Kathua slipped down to 20th position in DGGI 5.0 as compared to its 17th position in DGGI 4.0. Although district improved its

performance in Public Infrastructure, Public health, Legal & Public Safety and Environment sectors.

District Pulwama, Kishtwar and Doda are top performers securing 1st, 2nd & 3rd rank in Agriculture & Allied Sector. District Pulwama excels in indicators like Horticulture Production, Mandis linked to e-nam & Kissan Credit Cards. Whereas District Kishtwar and Doda secured 2nd and 3rd position in Agriculture Sectors due to their improved performance in the Soil Health Cards, Kissan Credit Cards, Agriculture Credit, Crop Insurance, Mandis linked to e-nam etc.

District Srinagar followed by Ganderbal and Jammu secured 1st 2nd & 3rd ranks in Industries and Commerce as the indicators like Establishment under GST, MSME units registered and Credit to handicrafts marked an increase in these districts in DGGI 5.0.

District Budgam, Anantnag & Kulgam attained 1st, 2nd & 3rd rank under Human Resource Development sector by noticeable improvement in indicators like Gender Parity, availability of basic facilities in Schools, Mid Day Meal and Skill training.

District Kulgam is ranked 1st in Public Health Sector followed by Districts, Samba & Jammu. This ranking in Public Health sector is due to impetus given to the indicators like IMR, MMR, Immunization, Institutional deliveries, Conversion of PHCs into Health and Wellness Centers, FRUs and Golden cards.

Districts Ganderbal, Shopian & Srinagar are top performers in Public Infrastructure and utilities sector with 1st, 2nd & 3rd ranks respectively, which reflects that these districts achieved targets of PMAY, Safe drinking water and all weather roads under PMGSY.

District Jammu notched 1st rank under Social Welfare and Development sector followed by Kishtwar and Kathua Districts. Better performance in indicators like Employment provided under MGNAREGA, Atal Pension Yojana and PMSBY helped these Districts to achieve top ranks in DGGI 5.0.

District Reasi, Samba & Pulwama, ranked 1st, 2nd and 3rd respectively in Financial Inclusion Sector. Increase in value of indicators like Jan Dhan Yojna, Mudra loan scheme and disbursement under self employment scheme helped them to achieve this position in DGGI 5.0.

District Udampur, Anantnag and Jammu ranked 1st, 2nd & 3rd in Legal & Public Safety sector. The DGGI 5.0 shows that District performed better in reducing frequency of crime against women, Road accidents besides, achieving higher conviction rate.

District Ganderbal ranked 1st in Environment Sector, while as, district Shopian & Srinagar secured 2nd & 3rd place respectively. These positions are based on performance of indicators like forest cover and water bodies and wet lands.

District Kulgam and Srinagar shared rank 1st in Citizen Centric Governance Sector, while as Pulwama & Baramulla got the rank of 2nd & 3rd. Noticeable performance of these Districts is witnessed in Grievance Redressal & conversion of Government offices to E-office which helped them in achieving top-ranking in this sector under DGGI 5.0.

The DGGI 5.0 presents an insight of the district administration governance delivery mechanism and presents an avenue to gear up weaker areas and find innovative procedures & processes to bridge the gaps in targeted deliverables in a time bound manner. DGGI reports fosters healthy competition resulting in refinement of processes,

innovation and finding avenues of hand holding which is ultimately beneficial to the society at large in establishing a vibrant and growing economy.

Way Ahead

To make DGGI more inclusive and comprehensive, additional indicators are being considered depending on the availability and suitability of indicators across the districts. The DGGI Portal/dashboard is a crucial tool for computing indices and assessing governance performance. The roadmap entails improving the monthly portal/dashboard to make it more comprehensive and relevant. The annual DGGI is also being linked to the monthly DGG portal for consistent monitoring by the District administration for improving public service delivery mechanism.

CHAPTER 1



INTRODUCING THE DGGI

Introduction

Good governance is the effective, accountable, and transparent functioning of government institutions in the management of public resources and the protection of civil, cultural, economic, social, and political rights. It ensures that public administration operates within a strong legal and developmental framework, upholds the rule of law, and serves the best interests of the people.

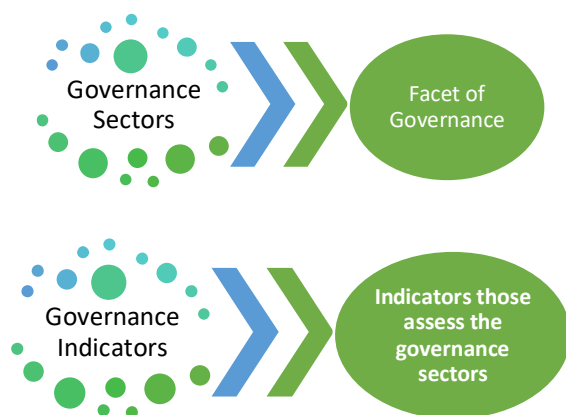
Good governance is the foundation of an effective public service delivery system, with measurable parameters to evaluate the performance of various divisions and administrative units over time. The District Good Governance Index (DGGI) serves as a comprehensive and practical framework to assess governance standards across districts, enabling their systematic evaluation and ranking.

District is the primary unit of field administration under decentralized planning, engaged in implementation of various welfare programmes and projects for the well-being of the citizens. A proper measurement of the performance, therefore, becomes necessary to remain focused in delivering the services to the public which leads to holistic development of the administrative unit. Good governance initiatives are reflected over a period of time in people's participation, rule of law, transparency, responsiveness, consensus oriented, equity and Inclusiveness, effectiveness and efficiency, accountability, etc.

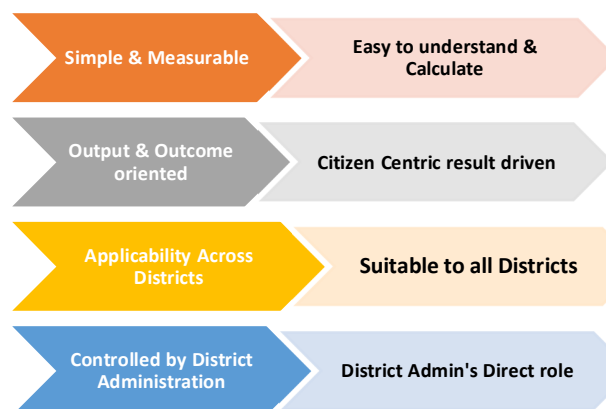
The main objective of assessing the performance of governance through District Good Governance Index (DGGI) in all 20 Districts of UT of Jammu and Kashmir based on identified sectors and indicators is to promote healthy competition and peer learning through best practices among the districts.

DGGI 5.0, the fifth edition in the series, provides a comparative assessment and ranking of districts on the parameters of citizen-centric governance, thereby promoting constructive competition among them. The Index serves as a guiding reference for District Administrations and other stakeholders to identify deficiencies, address performance gaps, and enhance the effective delivery of public services.

DGGI 5.0 Methodology

All 20 districts of the Union Territory have been ranked based on data collected across 58 indicators spanning 10 sectors. The methodology and indicator framework adopted in the first four editions of the DGGI have been retained for calculating sector-wise and indicator-wise scores, culminating in the final ranking of districts under DGGI 5.0.



The data on the identified sectors/ selected indicators has been obtained from the districts and has been scrutinized/ analyzed by the Directorate of Economics and Statistics and put to further calculation as per the decided methodology and formulas for the measurement of Good Governance Index.

- Sectors have been assigned equal weights.
- In some indicators, growth over the period has been measured while as others are target driven.
- The raw data has been normalized using Dimensional Index Method and subsequently used for ranking purpose after applying the respective weight-age assigned to the indicators.
- Scores of selected indicators have been aggregated to arrive at the Sector Score and thereby arriving at a Sector Rank. Sector Scores are then aggregated for calculating the Composite District Score.

Computation of DGGI 5.0

Step I: Compilation of Necessary Data/ Information

The calculation of scores for the indicators under the 10 sectors outlined in the DGGI Framework requires extensive data encompassing diverse aspects of district-level governance. For growth-based indicators, the reference year used in DGGI 1.0, 2.0, 3.0, and 4.0 has been maintained to ensure continuity and comparability. The relevant data for this assessment has been obtained from the District Development Commissioners.

Step II: Normalization of Indicator Values

Variables measured on different scales have been transformed into dimensionless values to enable meaningful comparison and facilitate ranking; this process is known as **normalization**. Various methods are available for normalizing variables and deriving scores based on district performance across identified indicators to compile sector-wise and overall rankings. For the purpose of ranking districts under DGGI, the **Dimensional Index Methodology** has been adopted.

In this method, the normalized value of each indicator is obtained by subtracting the minimum value among the set from the raw value of indicators and then dividing it by the data range (maximum – minimum value). The maximum and minimum values for each indicator are ascertained based on the raw values for that indicator across the Districts – combining all Districts without considering the existing Divisional (Jammu and Kashmir Divisions) categorization. This approach is specifically adopted so that such calculation would permit comparison across all Districts and can also be used for generating overall ranks – without considering the categorization.

The following two equations have been used to normalise the indicator values:

Dimensional Score for Positive Indicators:

$$\text{Score} = \frac{(\text{Indicator Value} - \text{Minimum Value})}{(\text{Maximum Value} - \text{Minimum Value})}$$

Dimensional Score for Negative Indicators:

$$\text{Score} = \frac{(\text{Maximum Value} - \text{Indicator Value})}{(\text{Maximum Value} - \text{Minimum Value})}$$

Where

Positive Indicator = for which Higher Value is better

Negative Indicator = for which Lower Value is better

Indicator Value = Available through Secondary Sources

Maximum Value = Highest Indicator Value among the Districts

Minimum Value = Lowest Indicator Value among the Districts

The above-mentioned equations has been used directly by taking the values of indicators for reference year. In case of the growth-based indicators, this exercise has been undertaken after calculating Compound Annual Growth Rate (CAGR) over base year to reference year for each indicator. The following equation has been used for calculating CAGR:

$$\text{CAGR} = \left(\frac{\text{value of Reference Year}}{\text{value of Base Year}} \right)^{\left(\frac{1}{n}\right)-1} \times 100$$

where: n = number of periods

Step III: Assigning Weightages

a. Equal Weightage to Sectors:

As mentioned earlier, while conceptualizing DGGI, various aspects of governance, which are critical for growth, development and inclusiveness have been measured which have been clustered under ten sectors. All the identified ten sectors are facets of equal importance from the point of view of citizen-centric approach for such comprehensive index at District level.

b. Differential Weightages for Indicators:

Outcome / output-based indicators were given priority for indicator selection and at the same time selection was restricted due to availability of data. Therefore, the outcome / output-based indicators are assigned higher weightage whereas proxy indicators (input/process based) are assigned lower weightage. Assigning higher weightages to outcome/output-based indicators brings the focus on performance and achievements of the Districts.

Step IV: Computation of Scores and Ranking

Upon completion of the data normalization process, the normalized value of each indicator is multiplied by the assigned weight to derive the final indicator score. These individual indicator scores are then aggregated to compute the sector score. After applying the prescribed sector weightages, the sector-wise scores are consolidated to arrive at the overall District DGGI Score, which forms the basis for district ranking.

Methodology to Measure District Performance (Indicator-wise)

To assess the performance of the district across various indicators, specific targets have been established for many of these indicators. For some indicators, national targets have been adopted, while for others, health and human resource-related targets are aligned with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

Targets are generally set as percentages, and performance is evaluated based on the percentage achieved. In certain cases, productivity is measured against national targets to be met. In other instances, the highest achievements recorded serve as the benchmark for the targets.

It is important to note that the primary focus of this approach is to measure improvements within the district relative to these established targets.

Limitations

Every statistical inference has inherent limitations; therefore, the results cannot be expected to be 100 percent precise or fully aligned with stakeholders' expectations. Nonetheless, efforts are consistently made to enhance accuracy and ensure robust outcomes. In the construction of indices, the underlying hypothesis, selection of indicators, and adopted methodology significantly influence the findings. Any change in these parameters would naturally lead to variations in the results.

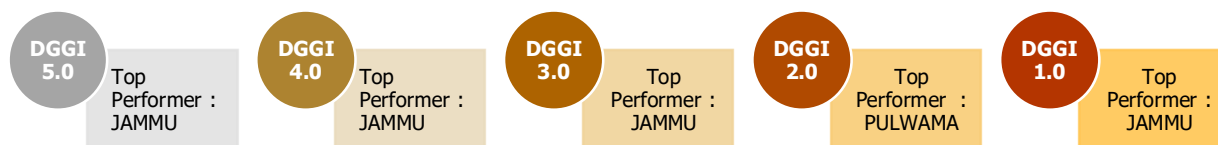
The findings presented in DGGI 5.0 are based on the same methodology and set of indicators used in the previous four editions primarily focusing on measuring delta changes, which were vetted by the Centre for Good Governance, Hyderabad. As governance systems continue to evolve, the Directorate remains open to refining the methodology and revising the indicator framework over time, subject to the willingness of the concerned departments and districts, as well as the availability of reliable data.

COMPOSITE DGGI 5.0 SCORE 2024-25



Ranking with Final Score (UT)

Composite DGGI 5.0 score for each of the 20 districts has been calculated at the Union Territory level by consolidating sector-wise scores across ten key domains: (i) Agriculture & Allied Sectors, (ii) Industries & Allied Sectors, (iii) Human Resource Development, (iv) Public Health, (v) Public Infrastructure & Utilities, (vi) Financial Inclusion, (vii) Social Welfare & Development, (viii) Legal & Public Safety, (ix) Environment, and (x) Citizen-Centric Governance

District Jammu has secured rank first in the DGGI 2024-25 with an aggregate composite score of 7.0552 while as District Pulwama and District Samba have secured 2nd and 3rd ranks with an average composite score of 6.7655 and 6.7587 respectively.

District Jammu performed in Public Health, Social Welfare & Development, Human Resource Development and Citizen Centric Governance while as District Pulwama has topped in Agriculture and Allied besides improvement in Public Health, Social Welfare & Development, Legal & Public Safety and Citizen Centric Governance. District Samba has 2nd in Public Health and Financial Inclusion besides improving its performance in Agriculture and Allied, Social Welfare and Legal & Public Safety sectors.

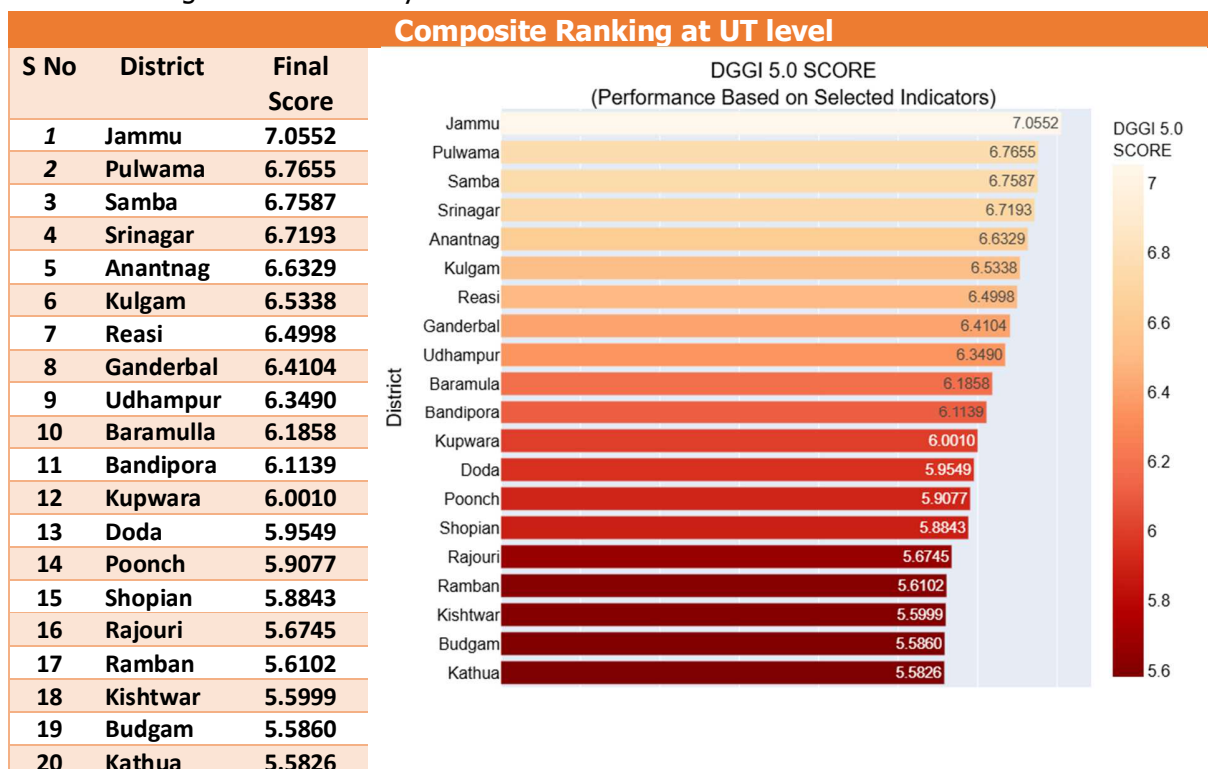
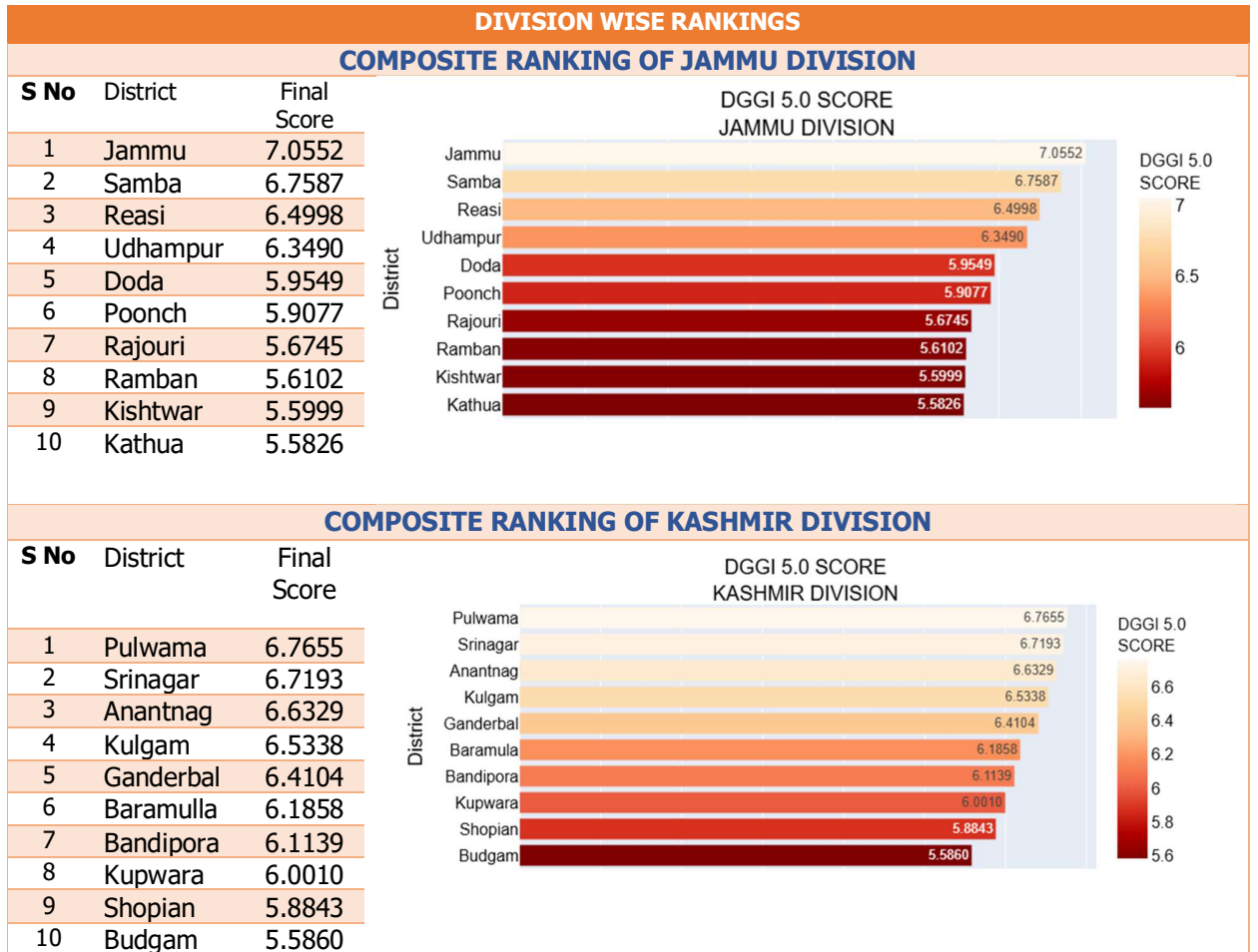

The annual ranking of districts has fostered healthy competition, motivating the districts to enhance performance and strengthen the public service delivery system. This process has led to overall improvements in governance outcomes, while enabling districts to identify and address areas of relative weakness. Each district has undertaken targeted interventions to achieve the prescribed benchmarks.

Rank wise comparison of districts in DGGI 5.0 vis a vis 4.0

The district rankings under DGGI 5.0 (2024–25) have been determined on the basis of 58 indicators distributed across 10 sectors, in accordance with the methodology outlined earlier. The composite DGGI 5.0 ranking has been derived by aggregating sector-wise scores across the following domains: Agriculture & Allied Sectors, Industries & Allied Sectors, Human Resource Development, Public Health, Public Infrastructure & Utilities, Financial Inclusion, Social Welfare & Development, Legal & Public Safety, Environment, and Citizen-Centric Governance.

The primary objective of DGGI is to present the State of Governance across districts and to foster healthy competition among the districts of Jammu and Kashmir. The overarching aim is to enhance citizen service delivery and make district-level governance more inclusive, transparent, and accountable.

To advance this objective, a comparative analysis of district-wise rankings in DGGI 5.0 vis-à-vis DGGI 4.0 has been undertaken. This comparison is intended to encourage sustained competitiveness and performance improvement among districts in the coming years. The comparative position is presented below:

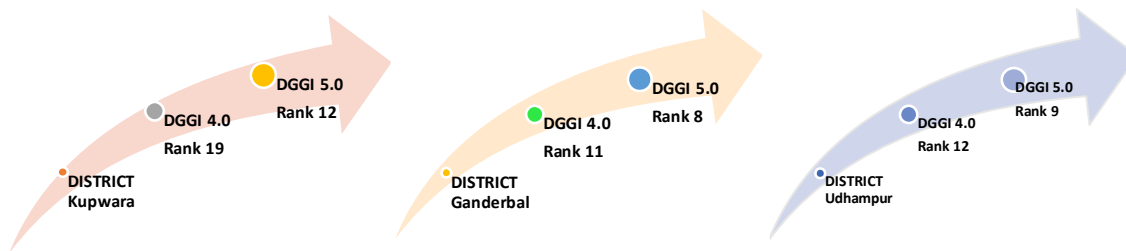

Achievers

District Kupwara has improved its overall position to 12th rank in 2024–25 from 19th rank in 2023–24. The district has recorded progress in 5 out of the 10 sectors, with notable improvement in Environment and Agriculture & Allied Sectors—advancing from 14th and 17th ranks in 2023–24 to 2nd and 7th ranks respectively in 2024–25.

District Ganderbal has significantly improved its standing, rising from 11th rank in DGGI 4.0 to 8th rank in DGGI 5.0. The district has demonstrated notable progress in key sectors, particularly Public Infrastructure & Utilities, Agriculture & Allied Sectors and Financial Inclusion, which are among its four best-performing sectors in DGGI 5.0.



District Udhampur has recorded a commendable improvement in its overall performance, advancing from 12th rank in DGGI 4.0 to 9th rank in DGGI 5.0. The district has shown notable progress in Citizen Centric Governance, Human Resource Development and Financial Inclusion, along with improved outcomes in three other sectors, contributing to its enhanced annual ranking

Low performers

District Shopian secured 15th rank in DGGI 5.0, compared to 6th rank in DGGI 4.0. While the district improved in one sector, however its overall standing declined due to a sharp drop in key sectors, including Human Resource Development (3rd to 11th), Public Health (2nd to 8th), Citizen-Centric Governance (4th to 11th), and Legal & Public Safety (10th to 17th).

District Rajouri has experienced a significant decline, slipping to 16th rank in DGGI 5.0 from 8th rank in DGGI 4.0. Although the district registered marginal improvement in three sectors, its overall position was adversely affected by weaker performance in the remaining seven sectors—most notably in Citizen-Centric Governance (from 2nd to 12th), Industries & Allied Sectors (11th to 19th), Public Health (9th to 12th), Public Infrastructure (16th to 20th) and Legal & Public Safety (5th to 10th).

Among the relatively lower-performing district Budgam ranked 19th in DGGI 5.0, as against 14th in DGGI 4.0. The decline is primarily attributable to reduced performance in Agriculture and Allied sector (7th to 19th) and Public Infrastructure (15th to 19th).

Sector-wise Performance of Districts

The Good Governance Index (DGGI) 5.0 presents a comprehensive assessment of governance performance in the UT of Jammu and Kashmir, covering all 20 districts. It evaluates district-level performance across multiple dimensions, providing meaningful insights into the quality and effectiveness of governance practices.

The Index spans 10 key sectors—Agriculture & Allied Sectors, Industries & Allied Sector, Human Resource Development, Public Health, Public Infrastructure & Utilities, Financial Inclusion, Social Welfare & Development, Legal & Public Safety, Environment, and Citizen-Centric Governance. By analyzing sector-wise scores and aggregating them into a composite score, DGGI 5.0 generates district rankings that reflect the overall state of governance and service delivery across the districts

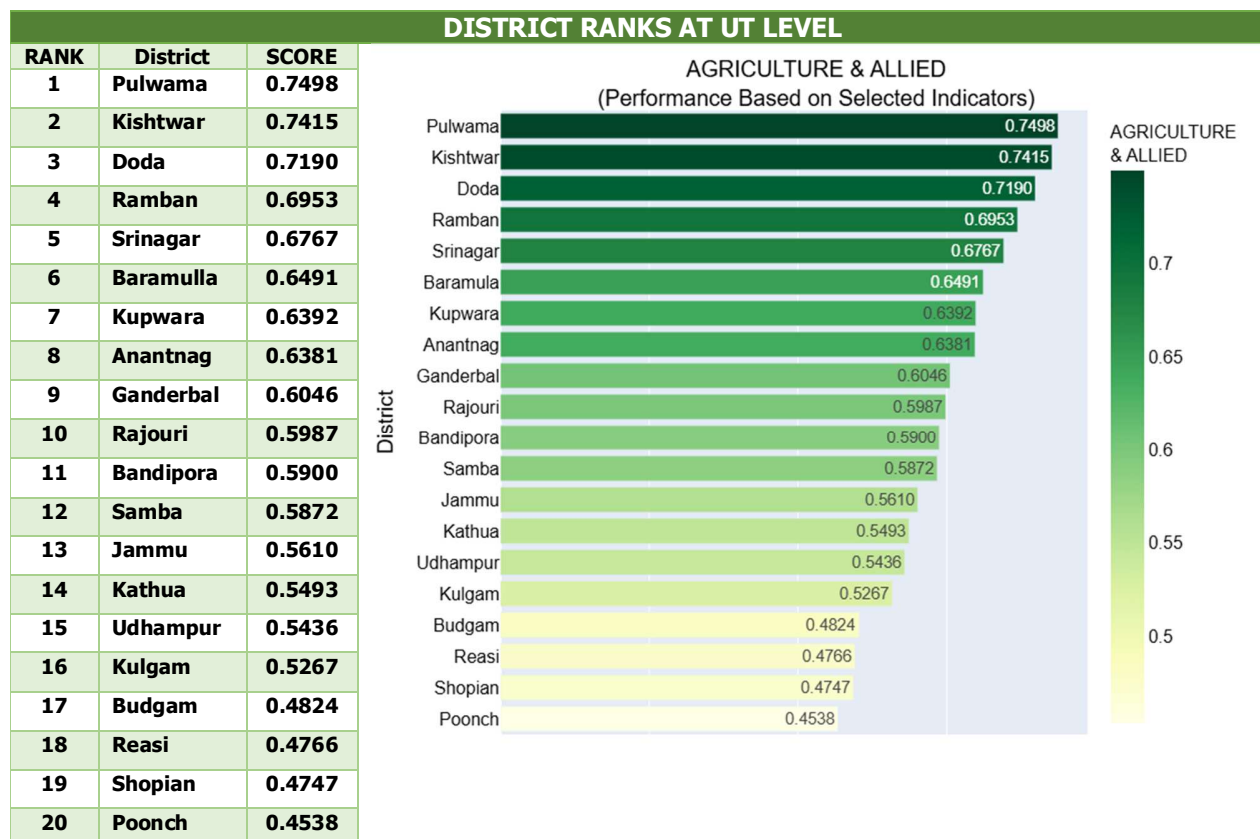
1. AGRICULTURE & ALLIED SECTORS



Agriculture & Allied Sectors represent the primary sector of the economy, encompassing agriculture, horticulture, and livestock development. This sector plays a pivotal role in the economy of the Jammu and Kashmir, given its significant contribution to livelihoods and rural employment. The UT is characterized by distinct geographical features and two major agro-climatic zones, each with unique climatic conditions that influence cropping patterns, productivity, and overall agricultural output.

The agriculture sector in the UT faces challenges on both demand and supply fronts. In response, the Government has undertaken several initiatives aimed at enhancing productivity, strengthening institutional support, doubling farmers' income, and reducing agrarian distress.

For the purpose of the Good Governance Index, due emphasis has been placed on maintaining sectoral balance and coherence through appropriate sub-sector stratification. Only broad-based and outcome-oriented indicators have been included. 11 indicators have been identified under this sector, focusing on output as well as institutional support mechanisms such as crop insurance coverage, animal vaccination, issuance of Kisan Credit Cards, Soil Health Cards, and related interventions.

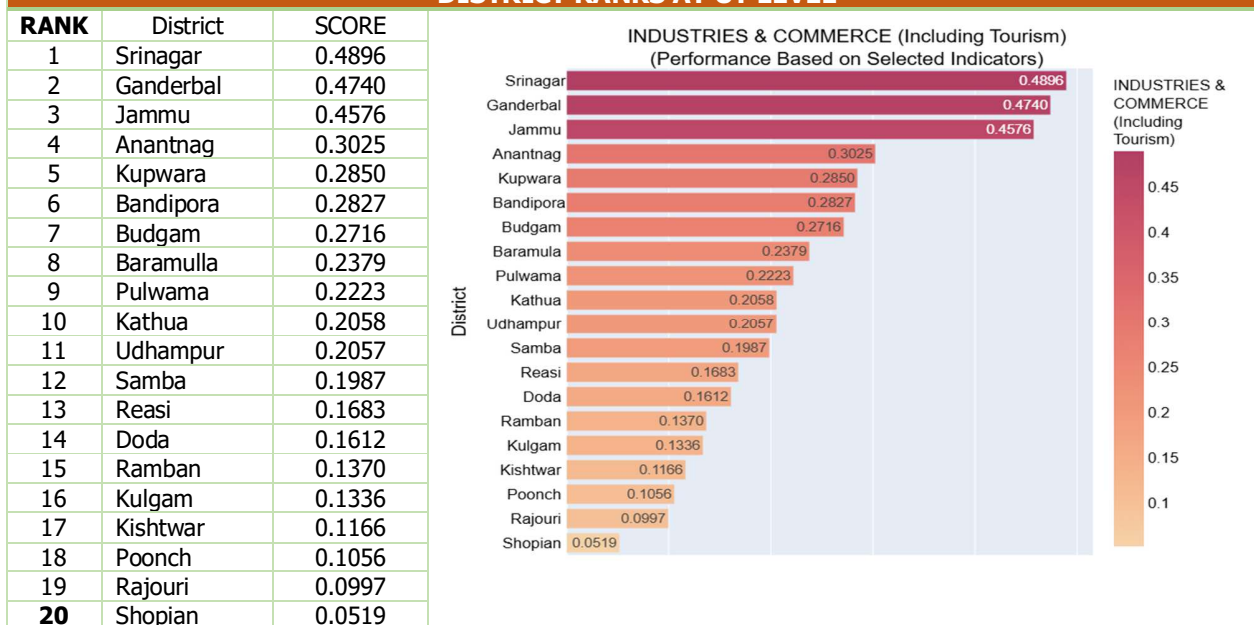

Recognizing its importance, the Government has accorded high priority to industrial development in the Jammu and Kashmir with the twin objectives of boosting the economy and reducing unemployment. Despite structural constraints such as inadequate basic infrastructure and difficult terrain, sustained efforts are being made through targeted schemes and policy interventions to strengthen Industry & Commerce, enhance the Gross State Domestic Product, and expand employment opportunities. Government of India has also emphasized the adoption of a Government-to-Business (G2B) model to facilitate ease of doing business and promote industrial growth.

Since many industry-related indicators are computed at the UT level, suitable proxy indicators have been incorporated for the purpose of DGGI. These include the number of establishments registered under Goods and Services Tax (GST), the number of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs), and related economic parameters. Given that tourism is a major economic and commercial activity in the UT and has been given status of industry, an indicator reflecting the number of tourist visits has also been included. Collectively, these indicators provide a realistic assessment of a district's performance in promoting economic activity and industrial development.

Furthermore, recent initiatives aimed at attracting diverse industries require systematic evaluation through measurable parameters such as growth in GST-registered establishments, expansion of MSMEs, credit flow to handicrafts and allied sectors, and promotion of self-employment, thereby ensuring a comprehensive assessment of industrial progress at the district level.

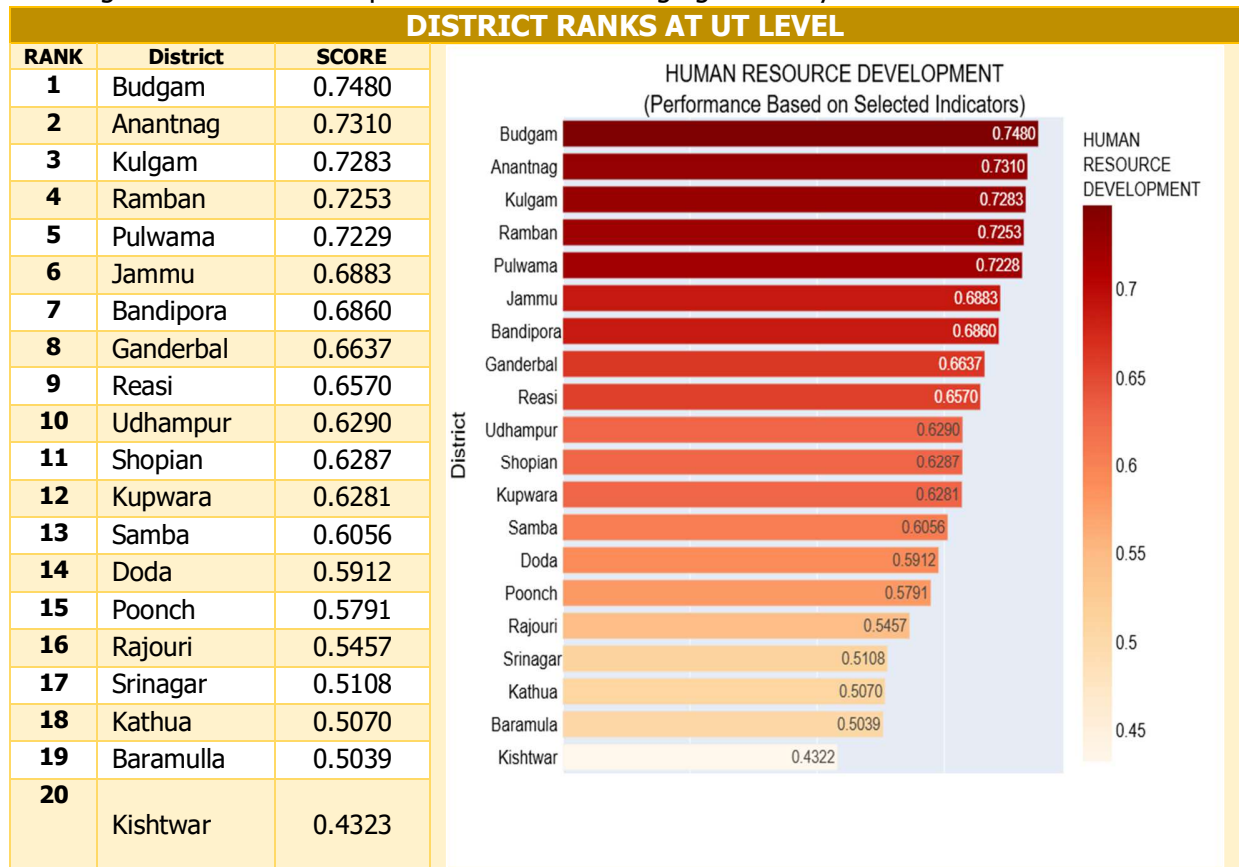

3. HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT



Education plays a transformative and pivotal role in strengthening the socio-economic fabric of the nation. As citizens constitute the most valuable resource, they require sustained nurturing through access to quality education in order to achieve improved standards of living and holistic development. Building strong educational foundations is therefore essential for fostering inclusive growth and long-term progress. Quality school education depends upon a focused emphasis on learning outcomes, efficient governance mechanisms, adequate infrastructure, and equitable access to academic opportunities. The Government plays a key role in ensuring universal access to education and maintaining standards across institutions.

To assess governance in the domain of Human Resource Development under the Good Governance Index, key indicators such as Gross Enrollment Ratio, Retention Rate, Gender Parity Index, and Pupil-Teacher Ratio (PTR) have been incorporated. Additionally, a skill development indicator has been included to evaluate the preparedness of the Union Territory to meet the evolving and diverse skill requirements of the emerging economy.

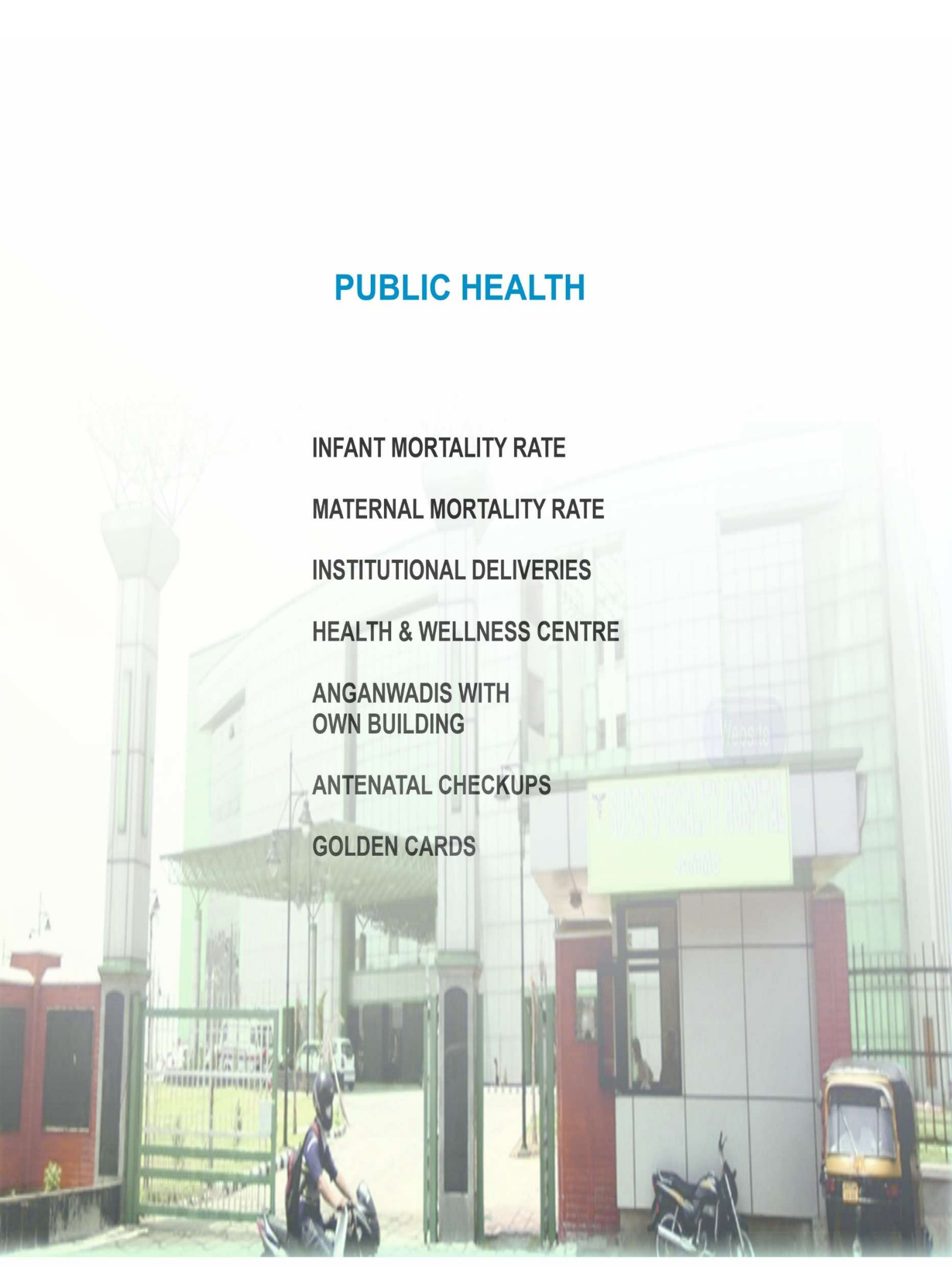

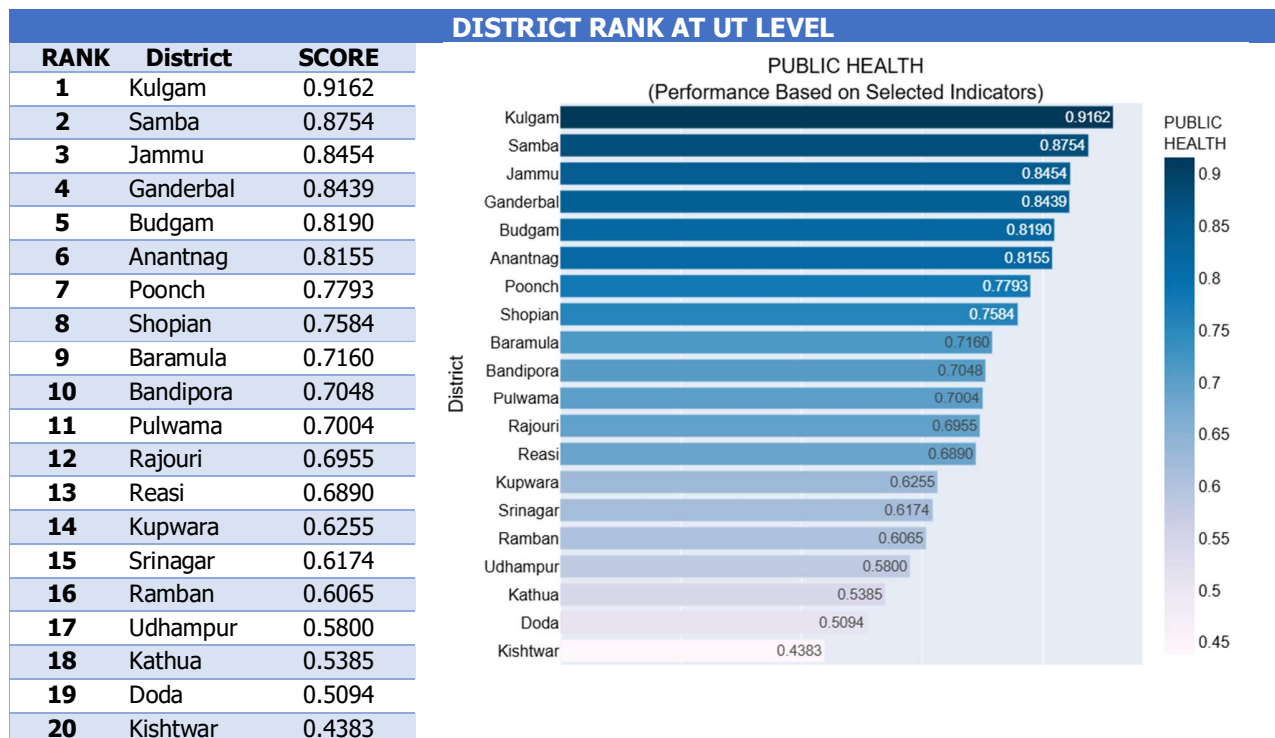
4. PUBLIC HEALTH



The health status of a population has a profound bearing on economic development, as poor health directly undermines human capital and productivity. Investment in health not only enhances individual well-being but also strengthens the overall economic and social fabric by promoting efficiency, innovation, and workforce participation. The health sector thus serves as a critical pillar for sustainable growth and inclusive development.

In recent years, the Jammu and Kashmir has shown notable progress in key demographic and public health indicators. Under the Good Governance Index framework, nine core indicators have been identified to evaluate district-level performance in this sector. These primarily focus on outcome-based measures such as Maternal Mortality Ratio (MMR), Infant Mortality Rate (IMR), and immunization coverage. The UT has generally demonstrated commendable performance on major health parameters, including MMR and IMR.

Comparative assessment of these indicators across districts facilitates the identification of gaps and enables the formulation of targeted interventions in lagging areas. The Index also considers indicators reflecting infrastructure and service delivery capacity, including operational Health and Wellness Centres (HWCs) and Anganwadi Centres housed in dedicated buildings. Additional parameters—such as the distribution of Ayushman Bharat Golden Cards and the functioning of First Referral Units (FRUs)—capture the effectiveness of healthcare infrastructure, policy execution, and institutional mechanisms in delivering essential health services.

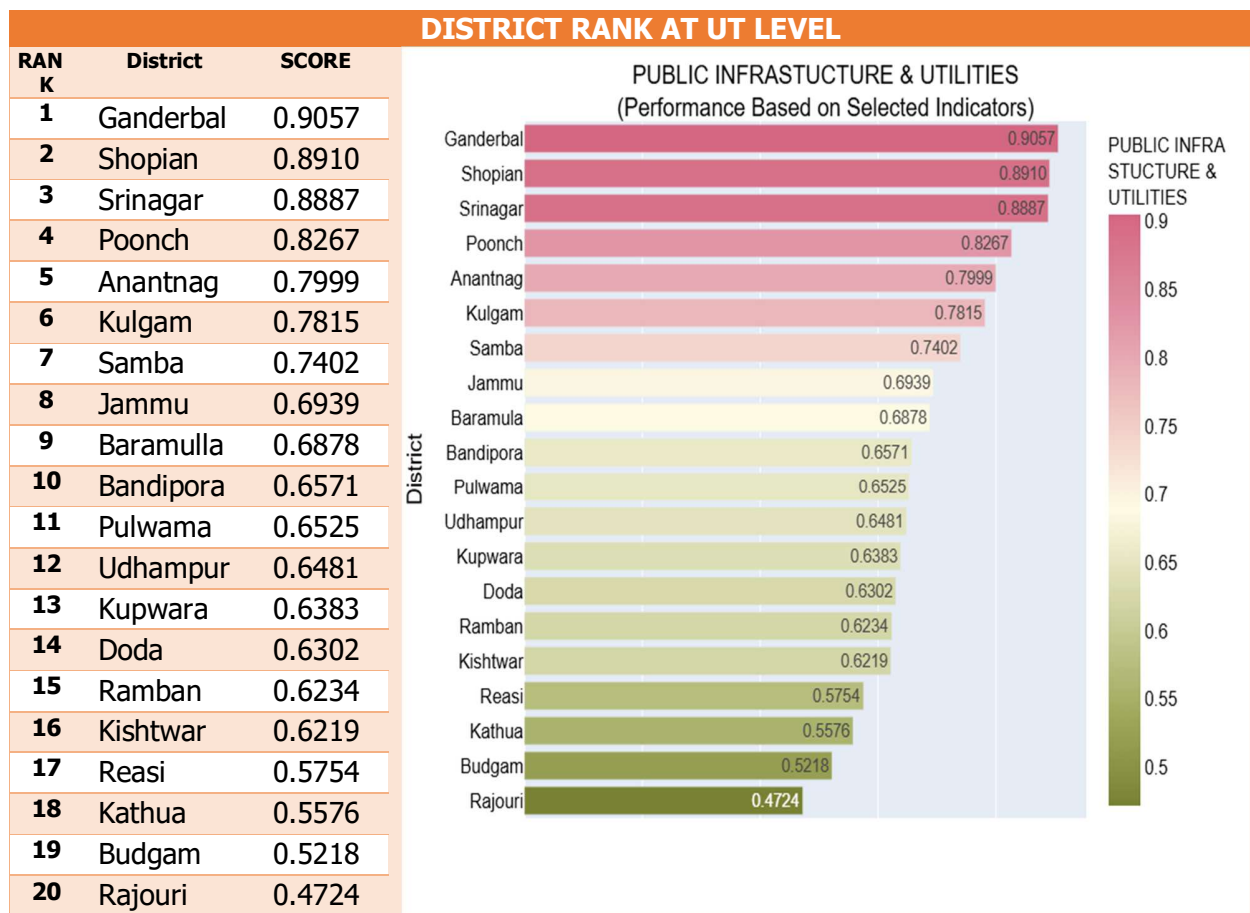

5. PUBLIC INFRASTRUCTURE



Infrastructure and utility services constitute the backbone of a well-functioning society, significantly influencing the quality of life and pace of socio-economic development. Recognizing their importance, the Government has accorded high priority to social overheads such as housing, safe drinking water, sanitation, road connectivity, and reliable power supply.

Under the Good Governance Index framework, this sector is assessed through six carefully selected indicators that capture the availability and accessibility of essential services. The key parameters include access to housing, provision of drinking water, road connectivity, and availability as well as coverage of power supply, thereby reflecting the overall status of public infrastructure and basic amenities at the district level.

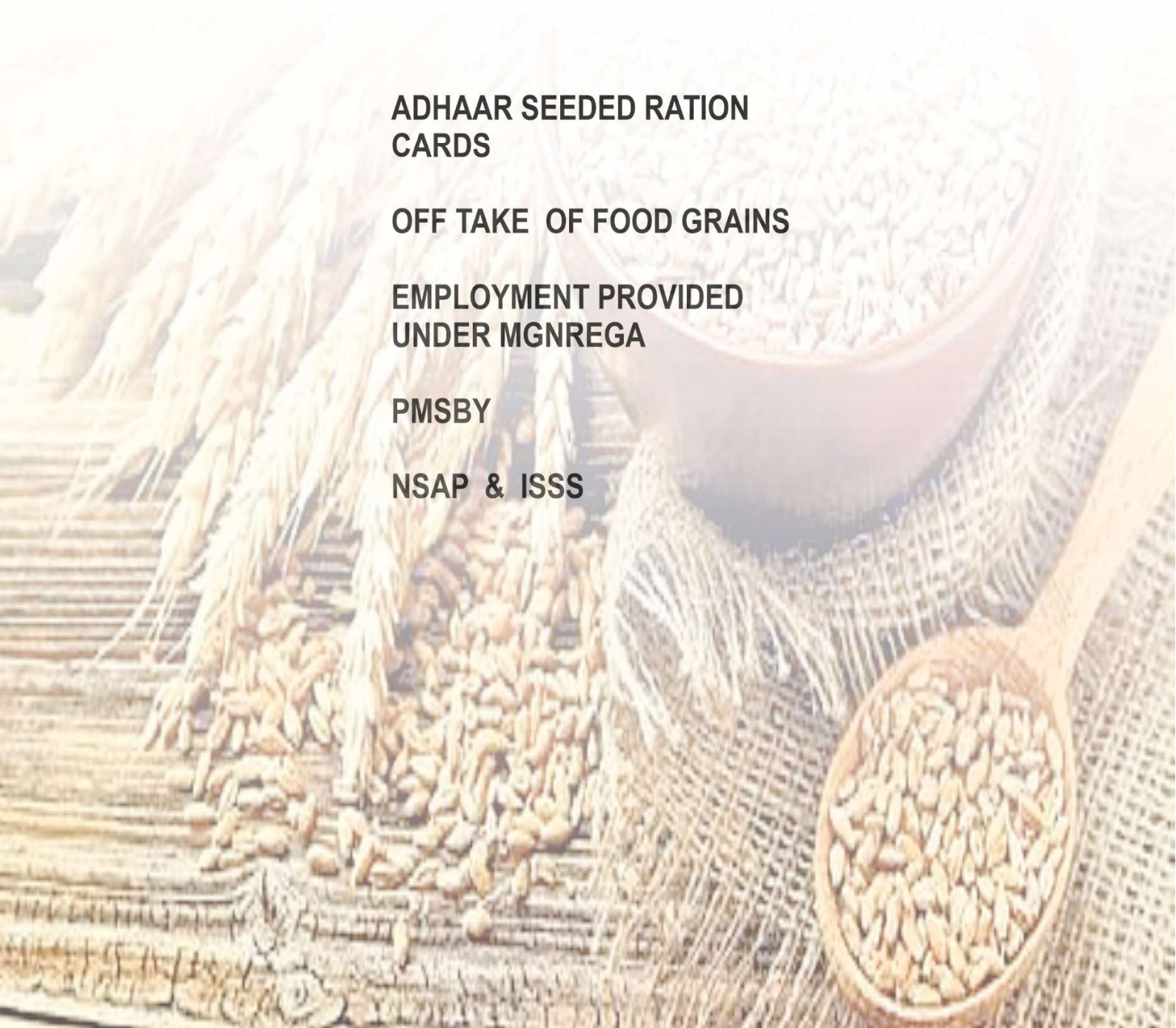

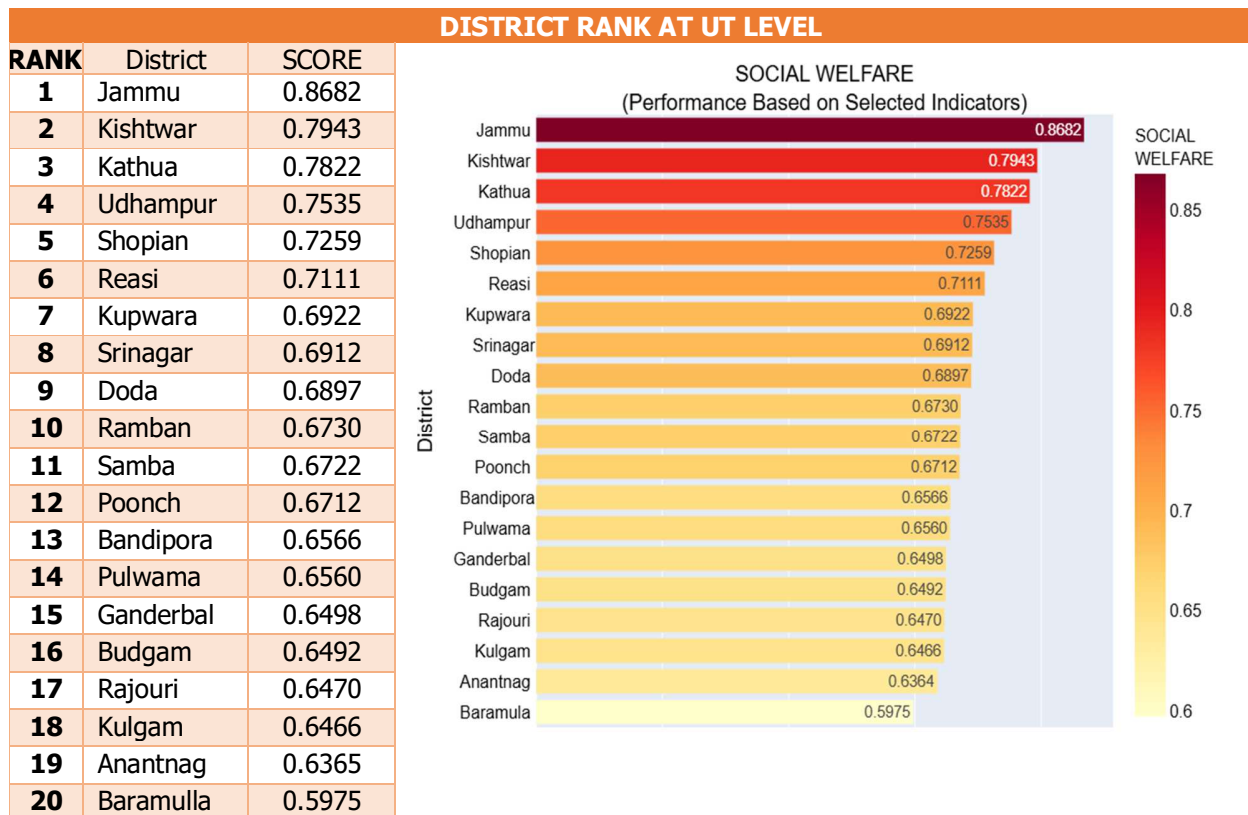
6. SOCIAL WELFARE & DEVELOPMENT



The welfare of citizens, particularly those belonging to vulnerable and marginalized sections, is central to the overall development of the Jammu and Kashmir. Social welfare initiatives are designed to provide support and social protection against risks such as poverty, unemployment, disability, and old age, thereby fostering social security and inclusive growth. These programmes aim to create enabling conditions that allow all members of society to realize their full potential and achieve self-reliance.

The Government remains committed to ensuring that the benefits of various State and Centrally Sponsored Schemes effectively reach the intended beneficiaries. Key initiatives in this domain include the Atal Pension Yojana and the National Social Assistance Programme, among others.

Under the Good Governance Index framework, this sector is evaluated through six indicators designed to capture the broader spectrum of welfare and development. These indicators encompass areas such as social protection coverage, Public Distribution System (PDS) performance, employment generation, and empowerment of economically weaker sections, thereby reflecting the effectiveness of welfare delivery mechanisms at the district level.

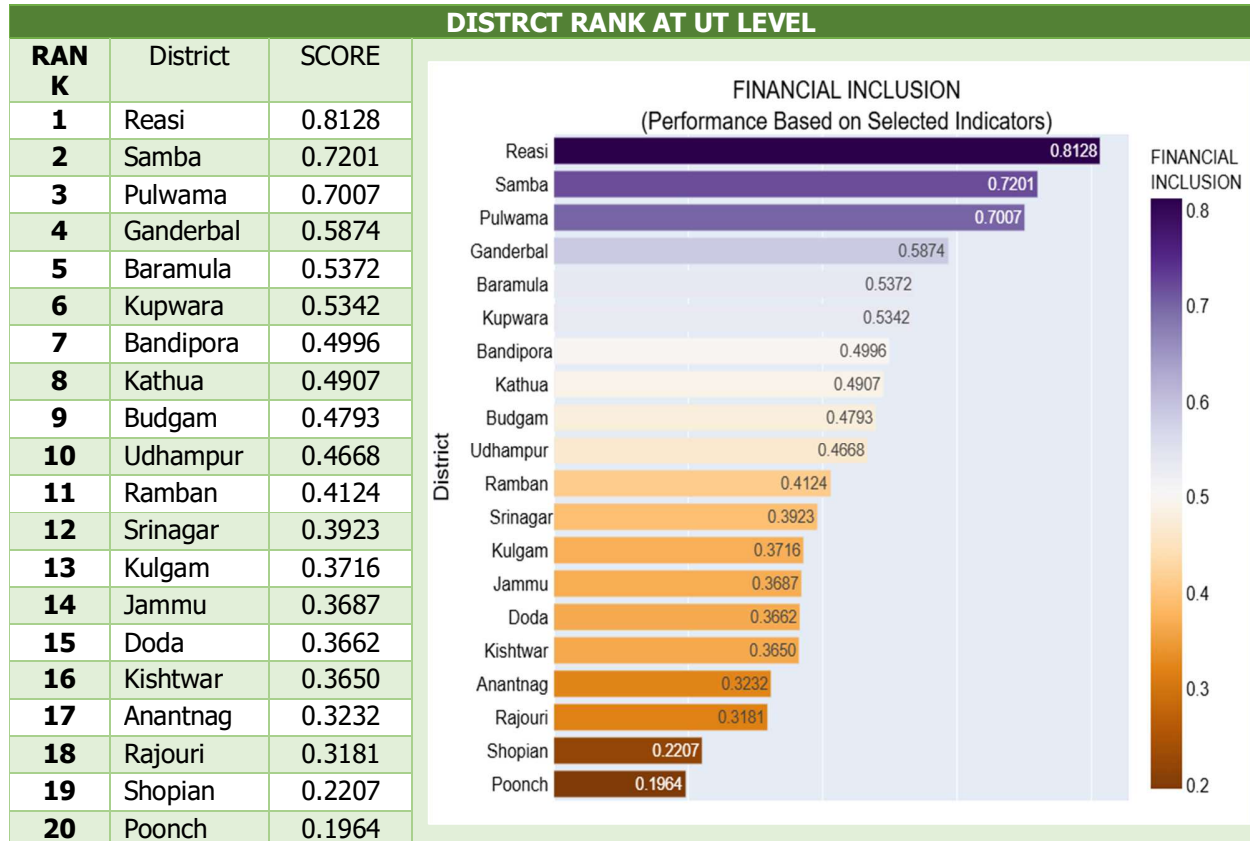


7. FINANCIAL INCLUSION



Financial inclusion refers to the process of ensuring that individuals and businesses have access to affordable and appropriate banking and financial services. Its objective is to integrate all sections of society—irrespective of income or savings—into the formal financial system. By extending basic financial services to economically weaker and marginalized groups, financial inclusion promotes economic participation, reduces vulnerability, and supports inclusive growth.

The initiative seeks to enable financial institutions to effectively reach low-income households and small enterprises with limited resources, thereby strengthening economic activity and self-employment opportunities. Under the Good Governance Index framework, this sector is assessed through key indicators such as coverage under the Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana and the disbursement of loans under the Pradhan Mantri Mudra Yojana, among others. These indicators collectively measure the extent of financial access and outreach among poor and marginalized populations at the district level

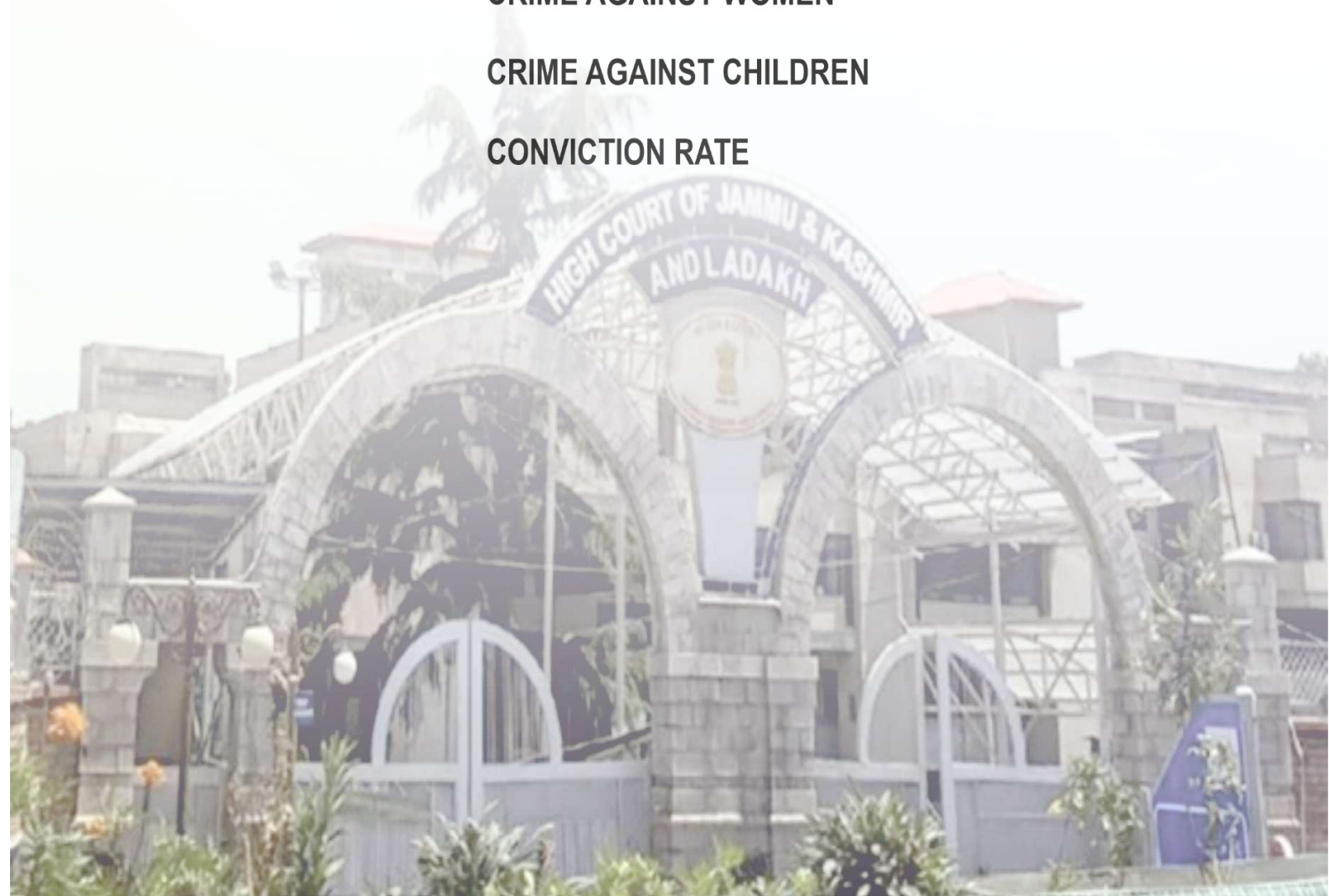

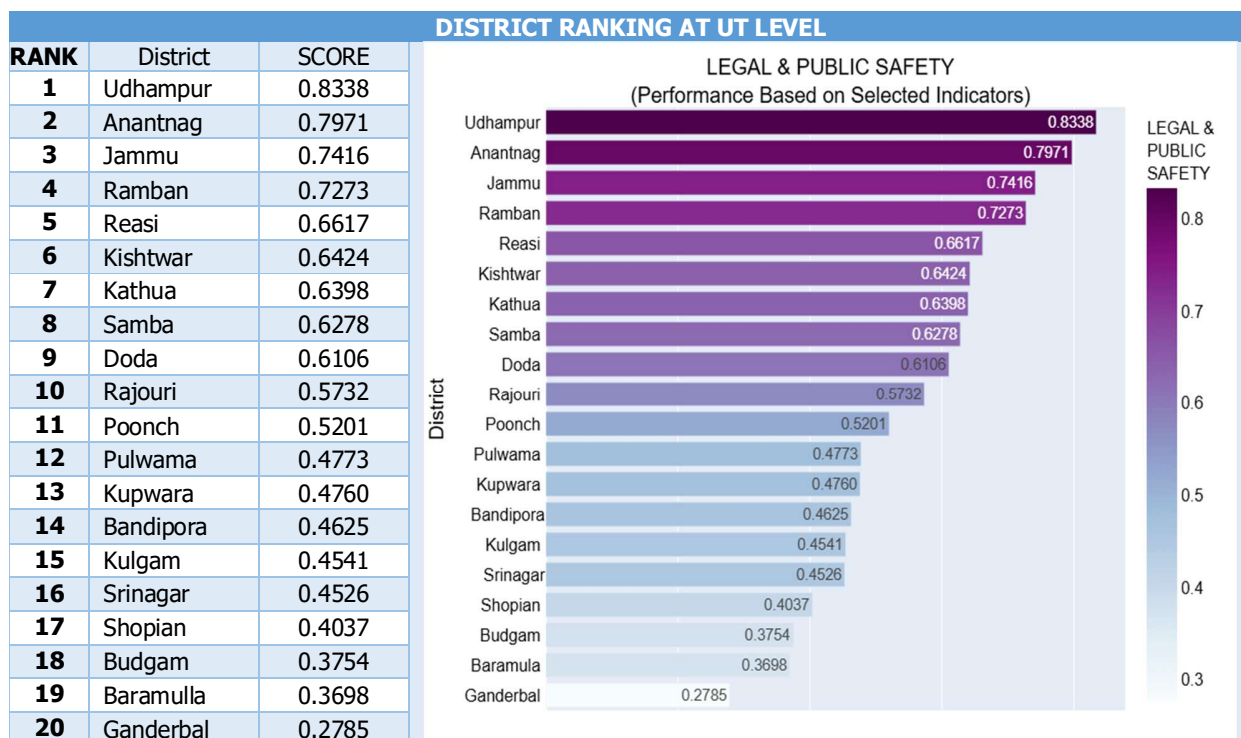


8. LEGAL & PUBLIC SAFETY

9. ENVIRONMENT

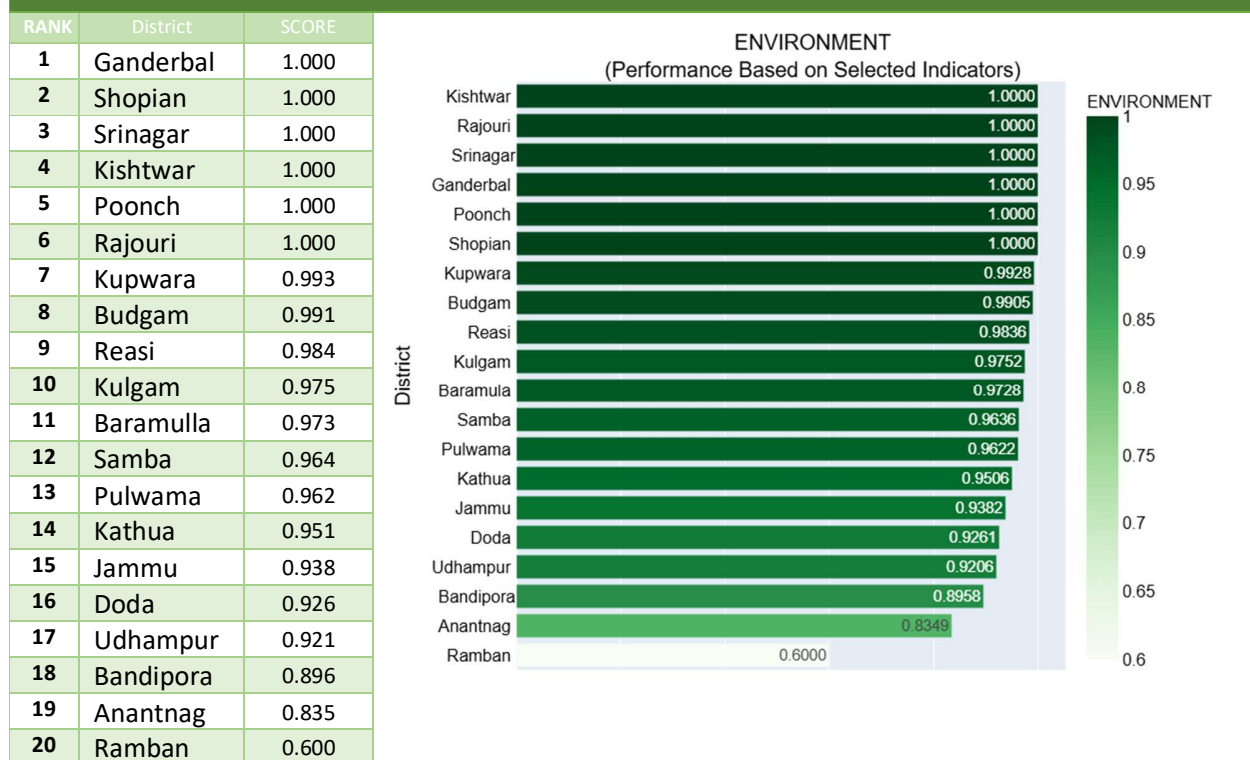


A healthy environment sustains life by providing essential resources such as clean air, safe water, and food, while also supporting economic growth and resilience against natural hazards. Environmental stewardship is therefore integral to sustainable development and long-term prosperity.

Under the Good Governance Index framework, environment-related indicators are assessed to evaluate progress in reducing negative externalities and promoting ecological balance. Environmental data, which can be analyzed across spatial and temporal dimensions, serve as a vital tool for understanding changes over time and strengthening evidence-based environmental governance. Effective governance practices can lead to improved outcomes such as lower carbon emissions, enhanced forest cover, and a greater share of renewable energy consumption relative to non-renewable sources.

Recognizing the centrality of environmental sustainability, this domain has been treated as a distinct sector in the Index. Given the growing concern over declining forest resources, change in forest cover has been included as a key indicator. The selection of indicators in this sector has been constrained by the limited availability of uniform and comparable data across districts. Nevertheless, a foundational framework has been established under DGGI, which will be progressively refined and expanded in subsequent editions of the Index

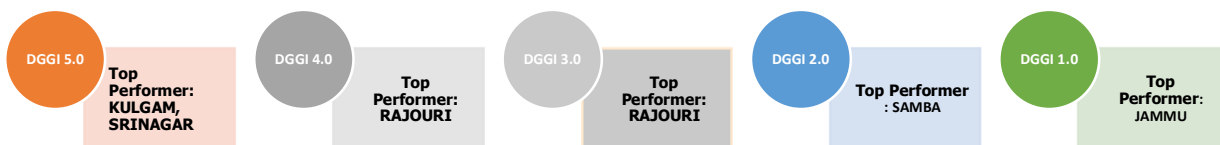

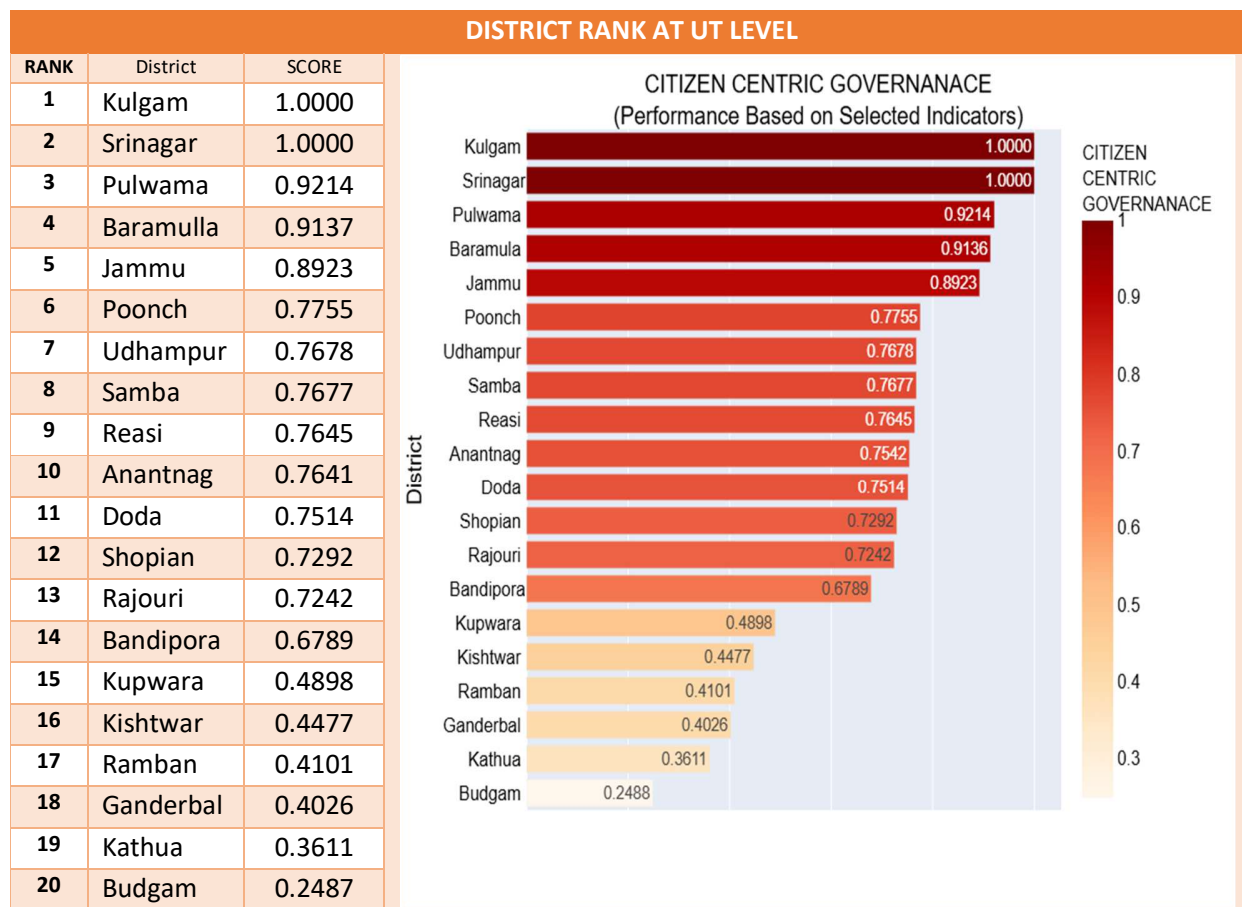

To strengthen service delivery, the Government has increasingly leveraged information technology through online portals, mobile applications, and digital platforms. Within the Good Governance Index framework, this sector incorporates indicators that assess the extent of grievance redressal, availability of government services in online mode, and the transition of government offices to e-office systems. Collectively, these parameters measure the responsiveness, accessibility, and modernization of governance at the district level.

CHAPTER 4



Outcomes and Impact Assessment

Good governance is a vital enabler of holistic and inclusive development. Since the district constitutes the basic unit of field administration, it is essential to assess district-level performance in implementing government programmes and innovative interventions aimed at improving citizens' welfare. The District Good Governance Index (DGGI), an initiative of the Jammu and Kashmir, has been institutionalized to evaluate district performance across identified sectors and indicators of governance. The Index has fostered constructive competition among districts, encouraging more efficient delivery of schemes and benefits to the intended beneficiaries.

A comparison between DGGI 4.0 and DGGI 5.0 indicates notable improvements in several districts, including Kupwara, Ganderbal, Udhampur, Baramulla, Kulgam, Pulwama, Ramban, Anantnag, Doda and Poonch.

Kupwara has made a significant leap from 19th rank in DGGI 4.0 to 12th rank in DGGI 5.0, demonstrating marked improvement in Agriculture & Allied, Public Health, Social Welfare, Environment and Citizen-Centric Governance. Focused interventions and achievement of sectoral targets have strengthened service delivery and outreach.

Ganderbal improved from 11th to 8th rank, with progress in Agriculture & Allied, Industries & Commerce, Public Infrastructure & Utilities and Financial Inclusion sectors. Effective implementation of schemes and attainment of set benchmarks have contributed to this advancement.

Udhampur advanced from 12th to 9th rank, performing strongly in sectors like, Citizen-Centric Governance, Human Resource Development, Industries & Commerce, Social Welfare & Development, Financial Inclusion and Legal & Public Safety. Initiatives such as timely grievance redressal and expanded online services have positively influenced outcomes.

Baramulla improved from 13th to 10th rank, with gains in Public Health, Public Infrastructure & Utilities, Citizen-Centric Governance and Industries & Commerce, reflecting strengthened administrative efforts in ensuring effective scheme implementation.

Kulgam moved from 9th to 6th rank, showing progress particularly in Citizen-Centric Governance, Public Health, Agriculture & Allied and Environment sectors. Timely grievance redressal and improved digital service delivery have contributed to its improved standing.

Ramban rose from 20th to 17th rank, with notable gains in Agriculture & Allied, Industries & Commerce, Human Resource Development, Public Health, Legal & Public Safety, Social Welfare & Development and Financial Inclusion sectors. Similarly, Pulwama, Anantnag, Doda and Poonch advanced by two ranks, reflecting improvements across Citizen-Centric Governance, Public Infrastructure & Utilities, Public Health, Human Resource Development, Agriculture & Allied, Social Welfare & Development and Legal & Public Safety sectors.

The institutionalization of DGGI has thus created a culture of performance-based competitiveness among districts. This has expanded the outreach and effectiveness of government programmes and narrowed the gap between the Government and citizens. On-ground impact is visible, as districts actively strive to meet targets across the 10 identified sectors encompassing 58 indicators, thereby strengthening governance outcomes across the Union Territory:-

1. AGRICULTURE & ALLIED SECTOR

The agricultural landscape across districts of the Jammu and Kashmir has demonstrated encouraging growth trends across multiple sub-sectors. In food grain production, 11 districts have recorded a positive Compound Annual Growth Rate (CAGR) from FY 2018–19 to FY 2024–25. Among them, Srinagar and Doda have emerged as leading performers, registering impressive CAGRs of 9% and 6%, respectively. This sustained growth reflects the Government's continued

focus on strengthening food security and enhancing agricultural productivity.

In horticulture, 13 districts have achieved positive CAGR during the same reference period. Pulwama, Kishtwar, and Doda have led the sector with CAGRs of 6.35%, 5.81%, and 5.50%, respectively. This performance highlights favourable agro-climatic conditions and improved agricultural practices, as well as the successful diversification beyond traditional crops, thereby strengthening district-level economies.

The dairy sector has also recorded steady expansion, with 13 districts showing positive trends in milk production during FY 2024–25. Samba has emerged as the highest contributor, accounting for 13% of total milk output, followed by Kathua and Udhampur, each contributing 11%. These figures reflect focused efforts to improve dairy productivity and meet the rising demand for milk and allied products.

The livestock sector has likewise shown robust progress. Sixteen districts have recorded favourable CAGR in meat production, with Samba leading at 8%, followed by Srinagar, Kishtwar, and Poonch, each registering 5%. In poultry production, 17 districts have experienced positive growth, with Udhampur and Doda achieving the highest CAGRs of 30.62% and 25.55%, respectively.

These gains across agriculture, horticulture, dairy, livestock, and poultry collectively contribute to the strengthening of rural livelihoods, enhancement of farmers' incomes, and overall economic resilience of the Union Territory

2. INDUSTRIES & ALLIED SECTOR

The industrial sector in the Jammu and Kashmir remains a key catalyst for economic expansion and a strategic avenue for addressing unemployment, particularly among educated youth. In recent years, sustained efforts have been undertaken to strengthen



industrial infrastructure, create an enabling investment climate, and provide institutional support for industrial growth. The development of industrial estates, logistics networks, and facilitative policies has served the dual purpose of attracting private investment and accelerating overall regional development.

During FY 2024–25, the UT recorded a steady rise in establishments registered under the Goods and Services Tax (GST). Among the districts, Jammu accounted for the highest share at 25% of total GST registrations, followed by Srinagar at 17% and Anantnag at 7%. This upward trend reflects expanding commercial activity and a broadening tax base across key urban centres.

The Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME) sector also registered significant growth under the Online Udyam Registration platform. Srinagar and Jammu led the way, contributing 14.95% and 13.40%, respectively, of total MSME registrations. Anantnag and Budgam followed with 9.11% and 8.37%, respectively. This growth signals a strengthening entrepreneurial ecosystem and expanding opportunities for employment generation at the district level.

In the Handicrafts sector, credit flow witnessed notable variation across districts during FY 2024–25. Ganderbal emerged as the leading district, accounting for 63% of credit disbursed to the sector, while Reasi recorded a modest 0.28%. These disparities underline the need for targeted financial interventions to ensure balanced growth of the Handicrafts industry, thereby enhancing its contribution to livelihoods and the overall economy of the Union Territory.

3. HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT SECTOR

The Human Resource Development (HRD) sector is a cornerstone of socio-economic progress and responsive governance, as human capital remains the most valuable asset of any society. HRD encompasses key dimensions essential for inclusive growth—promoting gender parity and women’s empowerment, strengthening skill capabilities through vocational and up-skilling programmes, ensuring adequate nutritional support, improving retention and literacy rates, and enhancing equitable access to education for marginalized communities such as Scheduled Castes (SCs) and Scheduled Tribes (STs).

Across the Jammu and Kashmir, notable progress has been achieved in advancing gender parity. Among the



20 districts, Ganderbal (99%), Kulgam, Bandipora, and Pulwama (98% each) have recorded particularly high Gender Parity Index values. Overall, fifteen districts have achieved a Gender Parity Index above 90%, reflecting substantial strides toward equal educational opportunities.

Quality enhancement measures are also evident in strong retention outcomes. Seven districts have reported retention rates exceeding 90% at the secondary level, with Jammu (99.98%) and Udhampur (96.90%) leading the performance spectrum. Furthermore, nine districts maintain commendable pupil-teacher ratios ranging between 1:12 and 1:15, ensuring adequate academic support and individualized attention for students.



Infrastructure augmentation has received sustained focus. Eight districts have achieved over 80% availability of essential facilities such as drinking water, separate toilet amenities, and electricity in schools, while the remaining districts continue efforts to bridge infrastructure gaps. Digital literacy has also been prioritized, with expanded computer access in schools to equip students with critical technological competencies. Additionally, all districts have reportedly achieved 100% coverage in skill training for registered students, reinforcing employability and holistic development.

Collectively, these achievements reflect sustained commitment to strengthening the HRD sector, with emphasis on gender equity, retention, teacher adequacy, infrastructure, digital empowerment, and skill development—laying a robust foundation for inclusive and sustainable progress across the Union Territory.

4. PUBLIC HEALTH

Public health is a critical determinant of socio-economic development and overall well-being, particularly in the Jammu and Kashmir, where a substantial proportion of the population depends on the Government Health Care System. Acknowledging this responsibility, the Government remains committed to strengthening, modernizing, and sustaining the healthcare delivery framework to ensure accessible, affordable, and quality health services for every citizen.



Encouraging progress has been recorded across districts in key health indicators. Full immunization coverage has reached 100% in 15 districts, reflecting the effective implementation of vaccination drives and strong community outreach initiatives. This achievement underscores the dedication of healthcare personnel and the success of targeted public health campaigns.



Institutional delivery rates also exhibit positive momentum. Fourteen districts have achieved 100% institutional deliveries, demonstrating improved access to healthcare facilities and safer childbirth practices. An additional six districts have reported

institutional delivery rates between 91% and 99%, indicating sustained efforts toward ensuring maternal and neonatal safety.

While certain health parameters still warrant focused interventions, substantial advancements have been made in expanding service coverage and improving outcomes. Continued investment in healthcare infrastructure, enhanced accessibility, and strengthened outreach programmes will further consolidate these gains and contribute to improved health standards across the Union Territory

5. PUBLIC INFRASTRUCTURE AND UTILITIES

Infrastructure and utility services form the backbone of a well-functioning society, directly influencing quality of life and regional development. Recognizing their importance, the Government has accorded high priority to housing, drinking water, sanitation, electrification, and road connectivity across the Jammu and Kashmir.

Under the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (PMAY), 14 districts have achieved between 90% and 99% of their sanctioned housing targets, while the remaining six districts have recorded 80% to 90% achievement, reflecting steady progress toward "Housing for All."

Provision of safe drinking water has also shown encouraging outcomes. Five districts have surpassed 90% coverage in access to quality drinking water. Nine districts have achieved coverage between 80% and 89%, five districts fall within the 70% to 79% range, and Rajouri has recorded progress between 60% and 69%.

Sanitation coverage stands out as a major accomplishment, with all districts achieving 100% access to sanitation facilities, promoting improved hygiene and a healthier environment. Electrification efforts have similarly advanced, with 17 districts attaining 100% household electrification, while three districts are nearing full coverage, underscoring the commitment to reliable power supply.

Road connectivity under the Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY) has significantly improved all-weather access. Kulgam has achieved 100% of its sanctioned road targets. Thirteen districts have completed over 90% of sanctioned kilometers, five districts have achieved 80% to 89% completion, and Reasi has reached 71% progress.

Collectively, these achievements in housing, water supply, sanitation, electrification, and road infrastructure reflect substantial strides toward enhancing living standards and fostering balanced regional development across the Union Territory.

6. SOCIAL WELFARE AND DEVELOPMENT

Social development remains central to inclusive growth, with particular emphasis on safeguarding the interests of vulnerable and marginalized sections of society in the Jammu and



Kashmir. Social welfare programmes are designed to bridge socio-economic gaps, prevent hunger and deprivation, and ensure equitable access to essential services and opportunities for the less privileged.

A significant milestone has been achieved with 100% Aadhaar seeding of ration cards across all districts. This accomplishment strengthens transparency and accountability within the Public Distribution System by eliminating duplication and curbing potential leakages, thereby ensuring that subsidized food grains reach genuine beneficiaries without hindrance.



In terms of food security, performance under the Targeted Public Distribution System (TPDS) and the State Sector Scheme (SSS) has been commendable. Sixteen districts have lifted 100% of the sanctioned food grains, while four districts have achieved off-take rates ranging between 80% and 99.99%. This strong off-take performance reflects the effectiveness of procurement, allocation, and distribution mechanisms, ensuring timely supply of food grains to fair price shops and ultimately to beneficiary households.

Overall, these achievements underscore the Government's sustained commitment to food security, transparency, and social protection, thereby reinforcing the broader objective of improving the welfare and nutritional security of the population across the Union Territory

7. FINANCIAL INCLUSION

Financial inclusion is a key enabler of inclusive growth, ensuring that individuals and small businesses have access to affordable, timely, and appropriate financial products and services. In the Jammu and Kashmir, the assessment of financial inclusion among poor and marginalized populations is based on indicators such as account penetration under the Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana (PMJDY) and the disbursement performance under the Pradhan Mantri Mudra Yojana (PMMY), among others.



Under PMJDY, progress has been moderate. Only three districts have succeeded in opening Jan Dhan accounts for more than 50% of eligible beneficiaries. Seventeen districts have achieved coverage ranging between 20% and 49%, while Srinagar remains below 20%, indicating the need for intensified outreach and awareness efforts in certain areas.

With regard to Mudra loans, Pulwama and Ganderbal have emerged as frontrunners in terms of total disbursement per one lakh population, reflecting stronger entrepreneurial uptake and credit linkages in these districts.



In the case of self-employment schemes, most districts have recorded positive Compound Annual Growth Rates (CAGR) in fund disbursement, demonstrating expanding support for livelihood generation. However, districts such as Shopian, Kulgam, Doda, Jammu, Poonch, and Rajouri have not shown positive growth trends, indicating areas where focused interventions may be required.

Overall, while meaningful strides have been made in advancing financial inclusion, targeted strategies and strengthened institutional outreach will be essential to ensure deeper penetration and equitable access to financial services across all districts of the Union Territory.

8. LEGAL AND PUBLIC SAFETY

Public safety remains the foremost responsibility of Government, aimed at upholding the rule of law, ensuring justice, and safeguarding individual rights across the Jammu and Kashmir. An analysis of key safety indicators for FY 2024–25 reflects inter-district variations in road safety and crime patterns.



In terms of road accidents per one lakh population, Anantnag reported the lowest incidence at 3.8 accidents, indicating comparatively safer road conditions. In contrast, Ramban (97.28) and Reasi (96.61) recorded the highest accident rates, highlighting the need for strengthened road safety enforcement and infrastructure improvements in these districts.

Regarding crimes against women, Kishtwar registered the lowest incidence at 22.62 cases per one lakh women population. Conversely, Ganderbal (184.53), Budgam (162.01), Kulgam (133.58), and Doda (102.64) recorded comparatively higher incidence rates, underscoring the need for focused preventive and protective interventions.



In the case of crimes against children, Budgam reported the lowest rate at 5.36 per one lakh child population, whereas Baramulla (52.34) and Samba (37.92) registered the highest incidence. With respect to conviction rates, six districts achieved conviction levels exceeding 50%, with Udhampur recording the highest conviction rate at 80.86% during FY 2024–25.

Overall, while certain districts demonstrate strong performance in maintaining public safety and judicial effectiveness, targeted strategies in road safety, crime prevention, and judicial strengthening will be essential to ensure uniform safety standards across the Union Territory.

9. ENVIRONMENT

Environmental preservation is not merely a choice but an imperative, requiring both collective and individual efforts to protect forests, reduce pollution, promote sustainable resource management, and strengthen conservation initiatives. Expanding forest cover remains a key pillar in building a sustainable and environmentally responsible future across the Jammu and Kashmir.



In this regard, notable progress has been achieved in safeguarding water bodies and wetlands. Six districts—Srinagar, Shopian, Kishtwar, Ganderbal, Poonch, and Rajouri—have achieved full protection of their identified water bodies and wetlands. These districts have implemented targeted conservation measures to prevent encroachment, control pollution, and restore ecological balance, thereby ensuring the long-term sustainability of these critical natural resources.



Such initiatives reflect a growing commitment toward environmental stewardship and reinforce the broader objective of achieving sustainable development while preserving ecological integrity for future generations.

10. CITIZEN CENTRIC GOVERNANCE

The Government of Jammu & Kashmir remains committed to enhancing citizen-centric governance through the expansion of online services, timely grievance redressal, and the conversion of government offices into e-Offices. By leveraging digital technologies, the administration aims to improve transparency, efficiency, and stability within the governance system. The adoption of e-Office platforms has streamlined workflows, strengthened record management, and fostered greater collaboration, enabling employees to function effectively beyond geographical constraints.



Over the past three years, nearly 81% of government offices in the Jammu and Kashmir have been converted into e-Offices, significantly enhancing administrative efficiency. In the area of grievance redressal, Baramulla, Kulgam, and Shopian have achieved 100% grievance disposal rates. Thirteen districts fall within the 80%–99% redressal range, while Budgam, Bandipora, Rajouri, and Doda record comparatively lower performance, ranging between 67.96% and 78.95%.

With regard to online service delivery, Srinagar, Doda, Kulgam, Jammu, and Rajouri have successfully achieved 100% online delivery of government services. Fourteen districts have transitioned between 80% and 99% of services to online platforms, while Kathua stands at 79.39% online service delivery.

Overall, these digital governance initiatives underscore the Government's sustained efforts to modernize administration, improve accountability, and deliver seamless public services across the Union Territory.

DGGI and Innovativeness: Fostering Good Governance

Good Governance embodies transparency, accountability, responsibility, participation, and responsiveness to the needs of the people. In the context of the Jammu and Kashmir, it

requires the optimal utilization of human, physical, and technological resources to design systems that align developmental goals, ensure prudent allocation of resources, and empower district administrations to innovate in line with public aspirations. Administrations grounded in the principles of Good Governance are better equipped to respond effectively to challenges, even when operating with limited resources.

For citizens, the effectiveness of governance is paramount. While people are willing to pay for quality public services, they expect systems that are transparent, impartial, accountable, and easy to understand. The need of the hour is to foster innovation within governance structures, guided by the Gandhian principle of Antyodaya—prioritizing the welfare of the last and most vulnerable person in society. Embedding integrity and ethical conduct within administrative processes is equally vital to strengthening public trust.

As reforms continue to reshape governance frameworks, adherence to these principles will remain central to ensuring sustainable, inclusive, and citizen-centric development

New approach to measure Good Governance

In an era defined by rapid technological advancements and the application of modern statistical tools, traditional governance approaches often fall short in capturing the dynamic and multidimensional nature of public administration. Recognizing this evolving challenge, the Government of Jammu & Kashmir adopted an innovative framework in the form of the District Good Governance Index (DGGI).

Launched in 2021–22 across the Jammu and Kashmir, the District Good Governance Index is the first initiative of its kind introduced by any State or Union Territory in the country. The Index provides a structured and evidence-based mechanism to assess district-level performance across 10 identified sectors and 58 development indicators. To ensure systematic data collection, monitoring, and transparency, a dedicated online portal was also launched in January 2022 for real-time data capture and performance evaluation.

This data-driven governance model marks a significant shift toward measurable, outcome-oriented administration, enabling informed decision-making and fostering healthy competition among districts for improved public service delivery

Accountability & Transparency

To strengthen transparency and accountability, the District Good Governance Index (DGGI) introduced by the Government of Jammu & Kashmir has significantly influenced policymakers, district administrations, and other stakeholders engaged in development processes across the Jammu and Kashmir. By institutionalizing measurable benchmarks, the Index has fostered a strong culture of responsibility and performance-based evaluation.

The indicators assessed under the DGGI provide a systematic and standardized framework for evaluating the functioning of district-level implementing agencies across various sectors. This structured assessment mechanism not only measures outcomes but also identifies gaps, enabling timely course correction and strengthening of existing government interventions. Administrators and stakeholders are thereby encouraged to ensure optimal utilization of resources and efficient service delivery to the public.

Furthermore, the Index has enhanced public awareness by enabling citizens to better understand and assess the performance of their district administrations. By making governance outcomes more transparent and data-driven, the DGGI has reinforced trust, encouraged informed public participation, and promoted a results-oriented governance culture

Release of DGGI Index (1.0, 2.0, 3.0, 4.0 & 5.0)

With the successful release of five editions, the District Good Governance Index (DGGI) of the Jammu and Kashmir, instituted by the Government of Jammu & Kashmir, has emerged as a pioneering tool enabling district administrations and stakeholders to identify weaknesses, bridge developmental gaps, and strengthen evidence-based decision-making. By promoting continuous monitoring, periodic reviews, and outcome-based assessment, the Index encourages districts to adopt innovative and creative solutions to governance challenges, undertake timely corrective measures, and sustain improvements, thereby fostering healthy competition and ensuring responsive, transparent, and result-oriented governance aligned with public expectations.

Benefits of Adopting DGGI

The District Good Governance Index (DGGI) provides a comprehensive assessment of key sectors—including Agriculture & Allied, Industries & Allied, Human Resource Development, Public Health, Public Utilities & Infrastructure, Social Welfare, Financial Inclusion, Legal & Public Safety, Environment, and Citizen-Centric Governance—each having a direct impact on the lives of the common populace. A distinguishing feature of the DGGI is its strong citizen-centric approach, recognizing citizens as primary stakeholders in governance. Through online platforms, residents can voice concerns and provide feedback, which directly contributes to evaluating governance performance. In addition to sectoral indicators, the Index specifically measures Citizen-Centric Governance, encompassing grievance redressal, delivery of online services under the Public Services Guarantee Act, and the conversion of government offices into e-Offices. Over the past few years, all districts have shown a consistent upward trend in these indicators, reflecting improvements in responsiveness, transparency, and service delivery.

Leveraging Technology for Data collection and Analysis

To measure the District Good Governance Index (DGGI), modern technological tools have been deployed, enabling the collection of extensive data on specified indicators through an online portal on a monthly basis. This system enhances the accuracy, timeliness, and objectivity of governance assessments while improving data quality through multi-level scrutiny. The launch of the portal and the systematic documentation of the DGGI present governance findings in a user-friendly format, making complex data accessible and understandable for policymakers, administrators, and other stakeholders. This approach promotes data-driven decision-making and supports continuous governance reforms across the Union Territory.

Public awareness

Government schemes and programmes play a vital role in addressing societal challenges, promoting development, and enhancing the well-being of citizens. Monitoring and assessing their effective implementation is essential to track progress and ensure outcomes. With the continual publication of the District Good Governance Index (DGGI), now in its fifth edition, awareness has increased among the public, policymakers, and administrators regarding best governance practices. The Index enables the government to evaluate the effectiveness of its schemes, identify gaps, and implement corrective measures or enhancements to address shortcomings, ensuring that objectives, targets, and milestones are achieved within the specified timeframe.

Positive impact /Creating Sense of Competition

The District Good Governance Index (DGGI) has fostered a spirit of healthy competition among districts, as evidenced over the past few years. Following its introduction, district administrations have intensified efforts to improve their rankings by enhancing public service delivery, promoting innovation, and strengthening institutional capacities. The Index serves as an incentive for administrators and stakeholders to continuously improve governance, ultimately

benefiting the population. Additionally, it facilitates the sharing of best practices across districts, creating a collaborative environment where successful approaches to programme implementation can be replicated and adopted for wider impact

Public perception and confidence

DGGI rankings significantly shape public perception and confidence in district authorities, as higher rankings reflect efficient, transparent, and accountable governance. Such recognition fosters trust in the administration, encouraging citizens to engage more actively and collaboratively with district authorities. As public confidence strengthens, residents are more likely to participate in addressing challenges that hinder development, thereby creating a positive cycle of improved governance and community involvement.

Way Ahead

Building good governance depends on the quality of organizational structures, the commitment and competence of leaders, and their ability to steer initiatives for the welfare of the public. Strong administrative capacity is pivotal in delivering essential services, fostering economic growth, and promoting social cohesion. When an efficient system is combined with transparent mechanisms, it ensures effective service delivery while creating sustainable and long-term benefits for society, thereby strengthening trust and resilience within the community

The targets of Amrit Kaal are closely aligned with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), particularly SDG 16, which embodies the principles of “good governance.” Establishing effective governance systems thus requires the integration of innovative ideas and approaches. By fostering innovation in governance, administrations can strengthen transparency, accountability, and efficiency, advancing the principles of good governance, promoting sustainable development, and addressing the evolving needs of society.

Enhancing Scope of DGGI

There is always scope for further improvement in any initiative. The department intends to enhance its scope and utility to make it more broad based and inclusive by including additional indicators, depending upon the availability and suitability of indicators across the districts.

DGG Portal/Dashboard

The DGG Portal/ dashboard is an essential tool for calculating indices and assessing governance performance. Future improvements aim to make it more comprehensive and relevant, including potential integration with other data platforms to enrich information and enhance the accuracy of the indices. Linking the annual DGGI with the monthly portal will also enable continuous monitoring by district administrations, facilitating timely actions to strengthen public service delivery and overall governance outcomes.

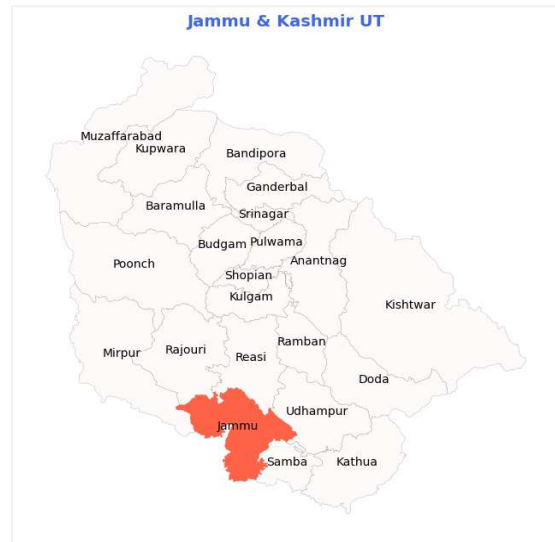


1. DISTRICT JAMMU

SCORE: 7.0552



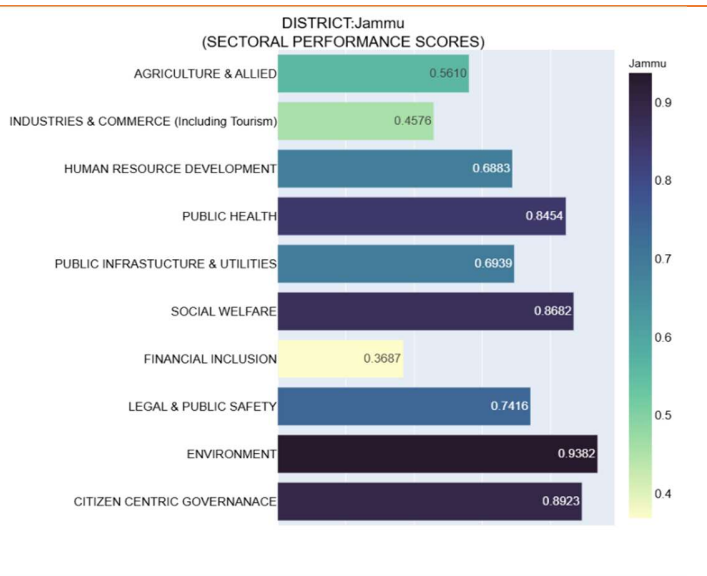
District Jammu, named after the city of Jammu—the winter capital of the Union Territory of Jammu & Kashmir. The city, famously known as the “City of Temples,” is believed to have been founded by Raja Jamboo Lochan in the 14th century B.C. Legend has it that after witnessing a tiger and a goat drinking water peacefully from the same pond, he decided to establish the city “Jamboo” as a place where the strong and weak could coexist in harmony.



Geographically, the district lies between 74°24’ and 75°18’ East longitude and 32°50’ and 33°30’ North latitude, approximately 600 km from New Delhi. Jammu district spans an area of 2,342 sq. km and has a population of about 15.29 lakh, making it the most populous district in the UT. Administratively, it comprises 21 tehsils, 20 community development (CD) blocks, 305 panchayats, and 915 revenue villages.

The district has 8.13 lakh males and 7.16 lakh females, resulting in a sex ratio of 880 females per 1,000 males. With a population density of 653 persons per sq. km, Jammu district has the highest population density in the Union Territory

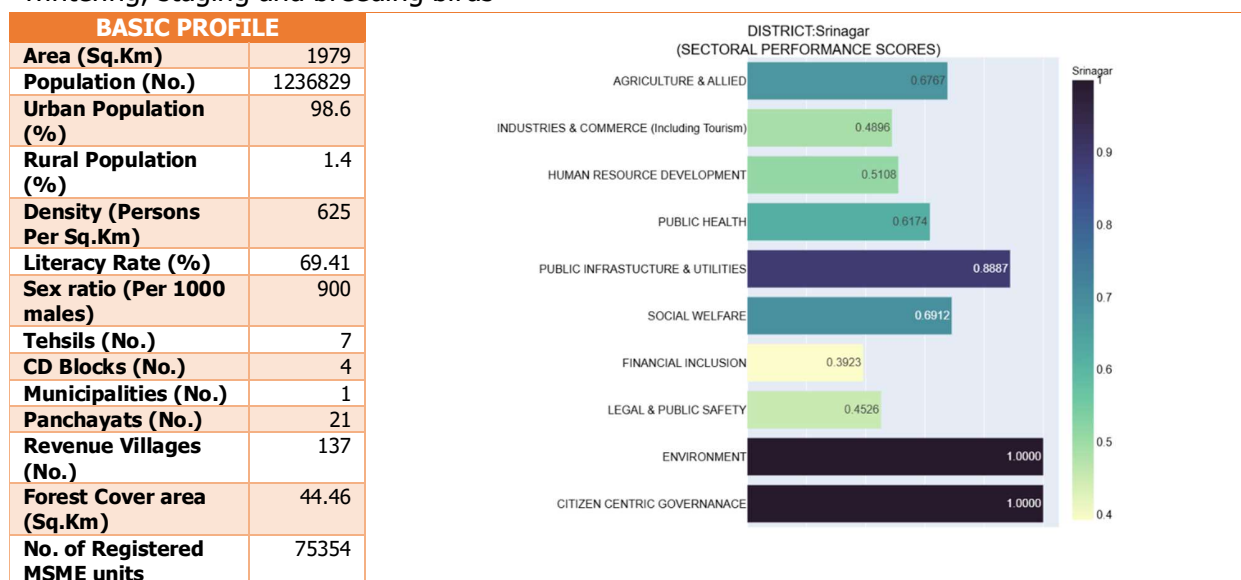


District Srinagar is the summer capital of Jammu and Kashmir (UT). It is situated in the centre of the Kashmir Valley on the banks of the **River Jhelum** and is surrounded by four Districts. The capital city of Srinagar is located 1585 Meters above sea level. The city is famous for its gardens, lakes, houseboats and religious places (Temples & Shrines). It is also known for traditional Kashmiri Handicrafts and Dried Fruits. The city is located on both the sides of the Jhelum River, which is called **Vyath** in Kashmir. The river passes through the city and meanders through the valley.

Administratively District Srinagar is divided into 7 Tehsils, 4 CD Blocks with 21 Panchayats and 137 revenue villages. Besides there is Srinagar Municipal Corporation for City of Srinagar.



A wetland namely *Hokersar* is situated near Srinagar. Thousands of migratory birds come to *Hokersar* from Siberia and other regions in the winter season. Migratory birds from Siberia and Central Asia use wetlands in Kashmir as their transitory camps between September, October and again around spring. These wetlands play a vital role in sustaining a large population of wintering, staging and breeding birds.

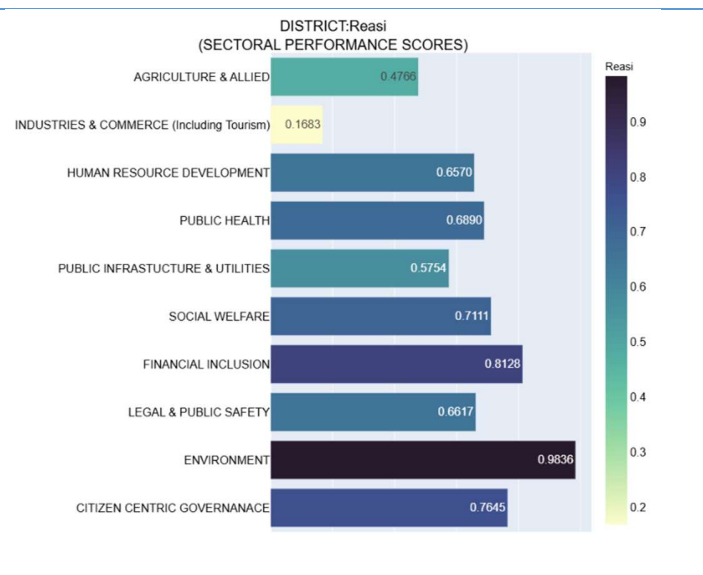


District Reasi has been carved out of District Udhampur in 2007.

The Ganderbal town is the District Headquarter and has derived its name from a famous spring Ganderbhavan with the passage of time, the name got changed into Ganderbal. Historically, Ganderbal acted as gateway to the Central Asia by constituting one of the most important station of the erstwhile Silk-Route.

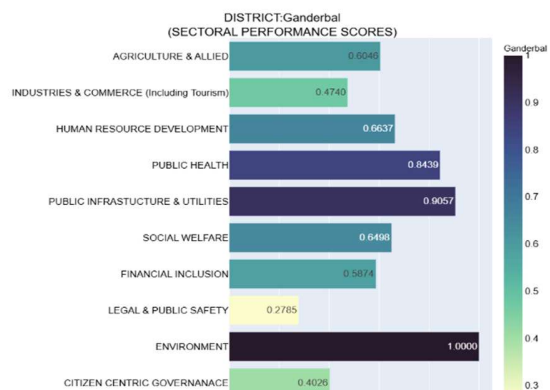
The District Ganderbal is located between 34.23° N Latitude and 74.78° E Longitude on the North of District Srinagar from which it was carved out in 2007. It mostly stretches from south – west to North-east with a length of 125 kms and this stretch has a width of around 10-20 kms at an elevation of 1650 to 3000 meters above the Mean Sea Level (MSL). Nearly 70% area of the District is hilly and semi-hilly.

Administratively, the District Ganderbal is divided into 6 Tehsils, 7 CD Blocks with 126 Panchayats and 136 revenue villages. River Sindh traverses a course of about 100 kms through the District with a basin exceeding 1556 Sq kms. The district covers the entire water shed of the river so the Sindh valley and the District has become synonymous.

The District Ganderbal holds some of the sacred pilgrimage sites like serene spring of famous Shri Mata Kherbhawani Durga Temple and Qamar Sahib and Baba Hyder(RA) Tullamula. An easy approach through Baltal to Shri Amarnathji cave has made the District World renowned. With the presence of tourist resort Sonamarg and Mansbal lake on its fringes and Sindh stream adding its importance & charm can contribute to the emergence of this area both as religious tourist destinations and recreational activities.

District Kupwara has been carved out of erstwhile Baramulla District in the year 1979. The geographical area of the District is 2379 sq.kms out of which forest area being reported as 1534.52 sqkm. The average temperature is ranging from -10 degree Celsius to 37 degree Celsius. The District is situated at an altitude of 5300 ft. above sea level. In the east and south, there are district boundaries of Baramulla and in the west line of control (LOC) separating it from POJK. It is about 97 Kms from Srinagar (Summer Capital of J&K UT) and well connected through road network. There are some famous passes of Himalayan range like Sadhna Top (Nastachen Gali) connecting Karnah Sub Division with District HQ and others like Tootmar Gali, Farkiyani Gali and Zamindar Gali (Z.Gali) connecting Leepa valley(POK), Keran and Machil areas with Kupwara District. The Kishan Ganga River, a major river other than Jhelum passing through the district.



Kupwara district is surrounded by thick forests, mountain slopes and snow-clad peaks from three sides. The district is dotted by magnificent and breathtaking natural beauty and has a great potential of tourist traffic. The district is famous for beautiful tourist places viz, Bungus Valley, Lolab Valley, Drangyar, Teetwal, Keran and Machil valley & other health resorts, famous in eco-tourism, adventure-tourism and border-tourism because of its natural scenery, climate and topography. 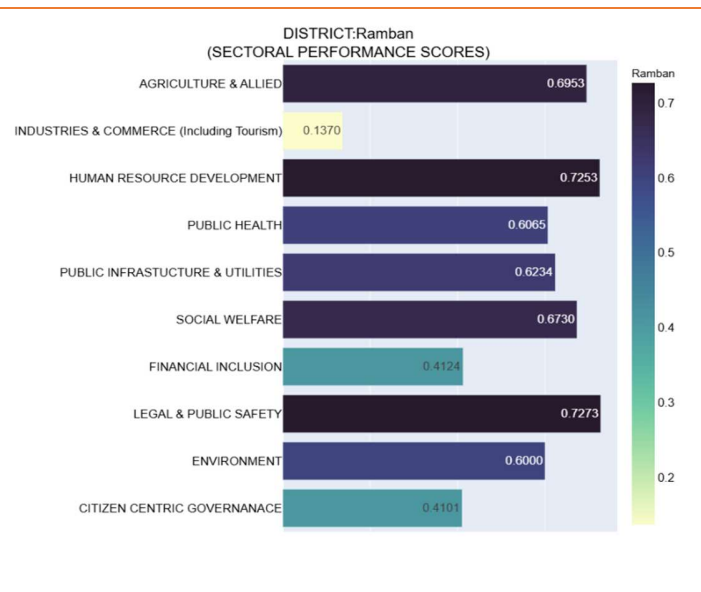
District Ramban comprises of 8 Tehsils, 11 CD Blocks with 143 Halqa Panchayats and 148 revenue villages.

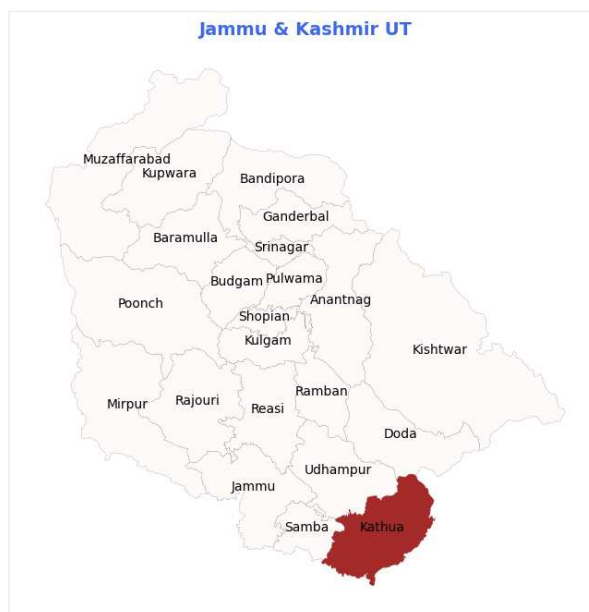
Kathua district, the Gateway to J&K UT. Known for its picturesque landscapes and rich cultural heritage, this district is truly a hidden gem.

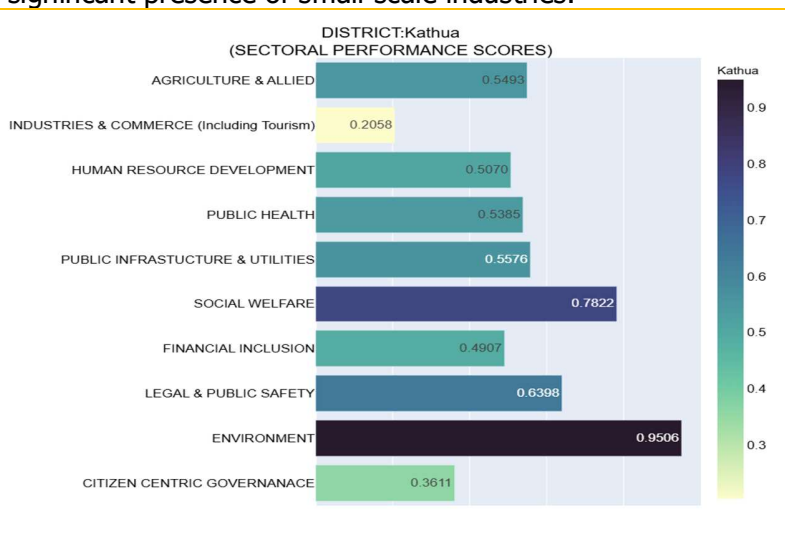

Chapter 6

Approach and Methodology

The first edition of District Good Governance Index (DGGI) of the UT of Jammu and Kashmir which was launched in January 2022, was developed by the Department of Administrative Reforms and Public Grievances, GoI in collaboration with the Institute of Management Public and Rural Administration using 58 indicators from 10 Governance sectors. The technical support for construction of Index was provided by the Centre for Good Governance, Hyderabad whereas the data was facilitated by the Directorate of Economics and Statistics, J&K. The selection of indicators was done after having extensive consultations with the senior officers of the DARPG, GoI and UT Government. Broadly, the following principles governed in finalizing the indicators:

- Simple and measurable
- Output and outcome oriented
- Applicability across the districts
- Primarily controlled by the districts

The process for identification of indicators, used in the DGGI 1.0, & 2.0 has gone through extensive consultations with senior officers of DARPG, GoI and UT of Jammu and Kashmir in a series of meetings, accordingly, the same set of 58 indicators across 10 sectors along-with the methodology adopted for construction of Index, have been used for DGGI 3.0, 4.0 & 5.0.

Components of District Good Governance Index Framework

The following 58 Indicators clubbed as part of DGGI 1.0 have been adopted for DGGI 2.0 of 10 Sectors finalized during the process of Jammu and Kashmir.

Methodology for Construction of DGGI

This section provides details about data capture from various sources of data and the process followed for calculating sector and indicator-wise scores for final ranking of the Districts as described below:-

Step I: Compilation of Necessary Data/ Information

Computation of scores for different indicators under 10 sectors prescribed in the DGGI Framework requires data on a large number of facets covering various aspects of governance at district level. To begin with, the index implementing agency needs to fix the reference year for ranking the Districts for data compilation purpose. Particularly, for growth-based indicators, data has to be compiled for three (at least) or five years (to be decided based on the data availability) preceding the reference year. The reference year used for growth based indicators in the DGGI 1.0 has been kept intact i.e. 2018-19. The data for this purpose has been collected from the District Development Commissioners.

Step II: Normalization of Indicator Values

Statistically, there is no sanity in comparing variables which are expressed in different units. Therefore, it is required to convert the variables with mixed scales into dimensionless entities, so that they can be compared and used for ranking purpose easily. This way of conversion is known as **normalization**. It helps in measuring and comparing composite indicators with ease. It also makes the aggregation of indicators meaningful. There are various methods available to normalize variables and attain scores for the Districts based on their performance on the identified indicators for compiling sector-wise/district-wise ranking. For the purpose of ranking the Districts as part of DGGI, the Dimensional Index Methodology is proposed to be used.

Dimensional Index Method is most commonly used for normalization of values and subsequent ranking. In this method, the normalized value of each indicator is obtained by subtracting the minimum value among these from the raw value of indicators and then dividing it by the data range (maximum – minimum value). The maximum and minimum values for each indicator are ascertained based on the raw values for that indicator across the Districts – combining all Districts without considering the existing Divisional (Jammu and Kashmir Divisions) categorization. This approach is specifically adopted so that such calculation would permit comparison across all Districts and can also be used for generating overall ranks – without considering the categorization.

The following two equations have been used to normalise the indicator values:

Dimensional Score for Positive Indicators:

$$\text{Score} = \frac{(\text{Indicator Value} - \text{Minimum Value})}{(\text{Maximum Value} - \text{Minimum Value})}$$

Dimensional Score for Negative Indicators:

$$\text{Score} = \frac{(\text{Maximum Value} - \text{Indicator Value})}{(\text{Maximum Value} - \text{Minimum Value})}$$

Where

Positive Indicator = for which Higher Value is better

Negative Indicator = for which Lower Value is better

Indicator Value = Available through Secondary Sources

Maximum Value = Highest Indicator Value among the Districts

Minimum Value = Lowest Indicator Value among the Districts

The above-mentioned equations has been undertaken after calculating Compound Annual used directly by taking the values of indicators Growth Rate (CAGR) over base year to for reference year. In case of the growth- reference year for each indicator. based indicators, this exercise has been

The following equation has been used for calculating CAGR:

$$CAGR = \left(\frac{\text{value of Reference Year}}{\text{value of Base Year}} \right)^{\left(\frac{1}{n}\right)-1} \times 100$$

where: n = number of periods

Step III: Assigning Weightages

Equal Weightage to Sectors:

As mentioned earlier, while conceptualizing DGGI, various aspects of governance, which are critical for growth, development and inclusiveness need to be measured, have been clustered under ten sectors. All the identified ten sectors are facets of equal importance from the point of view of citizen-centric approach for such comprehensive index at District level.

In addition, there is a possibility that during a particular period, one District might be more focused and channelizing its resources towards some limited prioritized sectors due to issues of area specific importance. And, at the same time, there is a possibility that one District might be giving equal importance to all sectors at once allocating resources equally/ proportionately. In such scenarios, there would definitely be a difference in outcomes achieved by either of the Districts. In such circumstances, the index should not provide any advantage or disadvantage to Districts for ranking purpose. Therefore, it is decided to give equal weightage to all sectors irrespective of the approach followed for ranking.

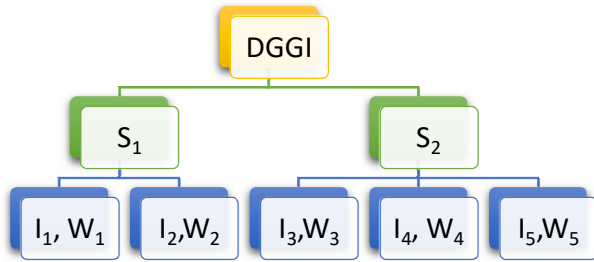
Differential Weightages for Indicators:

As already mentioned that outcome / output-based indicators were given priority for indicator selection and at the same time selection was restricted due to availability of data. Therefore, the outcome / output-based indicators are assigned higher weightage whereas proxy indicators (input/process-based) are assigned lower weightage. Assigning higher weightages to outcome/output-based indicators brings the focus on performance and achievements of the Districts.

Step IV: Computation of Scores and Ranking

After completing data normalization process, the normalized value of each indicator needs to be multiplied with weightage assigned to the indicator in order to obtain the final indicator score. These final individual indicator scores are aggregated to obtain a value for the sector. These aggregated values after multiplication with sector weight becomes the score for the sector and once sector wise scores are aggregated, it becomes District's DGGI Score to be used for ranking purpose.

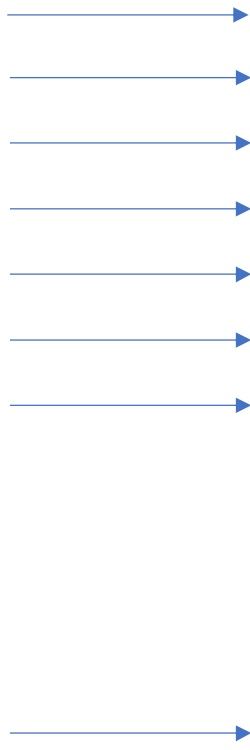

Methodology to Measure District Performance (Indicator-wise)

To assess the performance of the district across various indicators, specific targets have been established for many of these indicators. For some indicators, national targets have been adopted, while for others, health and human resource-related targets are aligned with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

Targets are generally set as percentages, and performance is evaluated based on the percentage achieved. In certain cases, productivity is measured against national targets to be met. In other instances, the highest achievements recorded serve as the benchmark for the targets.

It is important to note that the primary focus of this approach is to measure improvements within the district relative to these established targets.
